BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECT	ION 1. Section 626-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by	y amending rule 404, subsection (a) to read as follows:
3	"(a)	Character evidence generally. Evidence of a person's
4	character	or a trait of a person's character is not admissible
5	for the 'p'	urpose of proving action in conformity therewith on a
6	particula	r occasion, except:
7	(1)	Character of accused. Evidence of a pertinent trait
8	•	of character of an accused offered by an accused, or
9		by the prosecution to rebut the same $[\div]$, or if
10		evidence of the alleged victim's trait of character
11		for aggressiveness is offered by an accused and
12		admitted under paragraph (2), evidence of the same
13		trait of character of the accused offered by the
14		prosecution;
15	(2)	Character of victim. Evidence of a pertinent trait of
16		character of the victim of the crime offered by an
17		accused, or by the prosecution to rebut the same, or
18		evidence of a character trait of peacefulness of the

1		victim offered by the prosecution in a homicide case	
2		to rebut evidence that the victim was the first	
3		aggressor;	
4	(3)	Character of witness. Evidence of the character of a	
5		witness, as provided in rules 607, 608, 609, and	
6		609.1."	
7	SECT	ION 2. This Act does not affect rights and duties that	
8	matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were		
9	begun, before its effective date.		
10	SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed		
11	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.		
12	SECT	ION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.

Evidence; Character of Accused

Description:

Provides that if evidence of an alleged victim's character for aggressiveness is offered by an accused and admitted under paragraph (2), evidence of the same trait of character of the accused offered by the prosecution may be admissible.
