## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

This Act does not affect rights and duties that 8 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were 9 begun, before its effective date. **10** SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed 11 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored. **12** SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.

## Report Title:

Evidence; Character of Accused

## Description:

Provides that if evidence of an alleged victim's character for aggressiveness is offered by an accused and admitted under paragraph (2) or rule 404(a) of the Hawaii Rules of Evidence, evidence of the same trait of character of the accused offered by the prosecution may be admissible. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD1)
