A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE OFFICE OF LANGUAGE ACCESS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that language barriers
- 2 have imposed an increasing burden on government services in
- 3 recent years. Foreign-born individuals of Chinese, Filipino,
- 4 Vietnamese, Micronesian, and other ethnic descents do not always
- 5 arrive in Hawaii with the language skills needed to navigate
- 6 unfamiliar and sometimes difficult governmental organizations.
- 7 This barrier decreases government efficiency for clients
- 8 receiving services and increases manpower hours needed for
- 9 agencies to serve clients.
- 10 The legislature finds that the availability of translators
- 11 in government agencies would facilitate the delivery of services
- 12 and would increase the efficiency of state departments including
- 13 the judiciary, human services, health, labor, and others.
- 14 SECTION 2. Chapter 371, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 15 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
- 16 and to read as follows:

1	" <u>§37</u>	1- Language access translation bank. (a) The
2	office of	language access shall establish a language access
3	translati	on bank that shall consist of a group of translators
4	and inter	preters and shall be designed to meet the translation
5	and inter	pretation needs of residents of the State.
6	(b)	The executive director of the office of language
7	access sh	all:
8	(1)	Develop qualifications for translators and
9		interpreters with input from stakeholders,
10		professional translators, and interpreters, based on
11		recognized guidelines on professional translators and
12		<pre>interpreters;</pre>
13	(2)	Hire and train, if necessary, translators and
14		interpreters that meet these qualifications and the
15		needs of departments that may request their services;
16	(3)	Collect data on usage of translation services and
17		requests for services that may be useful in
18		prioritizing translation and interpretation
19		programming; and
20	(4)	Collaborate with agencies and departments that may
21		provide services for people for whom language is a
22		barrier."

1	SECT	ION 3. Section 371-36, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is	
2	amended to read as follows:		
3	"[+]	§371-36[+] Executive director of the office of	
4	language	access; duties. There is established within the	
5	departmen	t of labor and industrial relations, for administrative	
6	purposes only, an office of language access. The head of the		
7	office shall be known as the executive director of the office of		
8	language access, hereinafter referred to as executive director.		
9	The executive director shall be appointed by the governor		
10	without regard to chapter 76. The executive director shall:		
11	(1)	Provide oversight, central coordination, and technical	
12		assistance to state agencies in their implementation	
13	. 3	of language access requirements under this part or	
14		under any other law, regulation, or guidance;	
15	(2)	Provide technical assistance to covered entities in	
16		their implementation of this part;	
17	(3)	Review and monitor each state agency's language access	
18		plan for compliance with this part;	
19	(4)	Where reasonable access is not provided, endeavor to	
20		eliminate the barrier using informal methods such as	
21		conference, conciliation, mediation, or persuasion.	
22		Where the language access barrier cannot be eliminated	

1		by informal methods, the executive director shall
2		submit a written report with the executive director's
3		opinion and recommendation to the state agency or the
4		covered entity. The executive director may request
5		the state agency or the covered entity to notify the
6		executive director, within a specified time, of any
7		action taken on the executive director's
8		recommendation;
9	(5)	Consult with language access coordinators, the
10		language access advisory council, and department
11		directors or their equivalent;
12	(6)	Subject to section 371-33, create, distribute to the
13		State, and make available to covered entities
14		multilingual signage in the more frequently
15		encountered languages in the State, and other
16		languages as needed, informing individuals of their
17		right to free oral language services and inviting them
18		to identify themselves as persons needing services;
19		[and]
20	(7)	Adopt rules pursuant to chapter 91 to address the
21		language needs of limited English proficient
22		persons[.]; and

1	(8)	Maintain a group of translators in the five ethnic
2		languages that are determined to be the most
3		underserved by departments. The five ethnic language
4		shall be selected by reviewing each department's
5		language access plan. The translators shall be
6		available to each department upon request."
7	SECTI	ON 4. There is appropriated out of the general
8	revenues o	f the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much
9	thereof as	may be necessary for fiscal year 2009-2010 and the
10	same sum o	r so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year
11	2010-2011	to establish and operate the language access
12	translatio	n bank.
13	The s	ums appropriated shall be expended by the department
14	of labor a	nd industrial relations for the purposes of this Act.
15	SECTI	ON 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
16	and strick	en. New statutory material is underscored.
17	SECTI	ON 6. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2009.
