A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PUBLIC SAFETY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 353C, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
3	and to read as follows:
4	"§353C- Critical incident planning and mapping system;
5	established. (a) There shall be established by the department
6	a critical incident planning and mapping system to provide
7	information, standards, guidelines, and protocols to first
8	responders and other responding state agencies to help them
9	respond appropriately and efficiently to criminal or terroristic
10	acts, or related emergencies, occurring in any public school in
11	this State.
12	(b) The critical incident planning and mapping system
13	shall at a minimum consist of the following:
14	(1) A computer software program that includes floor plans,
15	fire protection information, building evacuation
16	plans, utility information, information regarding
17	known hazards, and information on how to contact

1		emergency personnel for every public school in this
2		State;
3	(2)	The preferred manner on how to assimilate and disperse
4		the critical incident planning and mapping system
5		information from the state agencies and the political
6		subdivisions that participate in the critical incident
7		planning and mapping system;
8	(3)	Guidelines, standards, and a uniform protocol for the
9		state agencies and political subdivisions that
10		subscribe to using the information from the critical
11		incident planning and mapping system software;
12	(4)	Conditions for using the critical incident planning
13		and mapping system by first responders and other
14		responding state agencies;
15	<u>(5)</u>	Standards for ensuring confidentiality of facility
16		information and providing widespread access to the
17		information contained in the critical incident
18		planning and mapping system; and
19	<u>(6)</u>	Guidelines for the training of persons employed by
20		first responders and other responding state agencies
21		concerning the use of the critical incident planning
22		and mapping system.



1	(c)	To t	he extent money is made available, the state
2	agencies	and p	olitical subdivisions shall:
3	(1)	Part	icipate in the critical incident planning and
4		mapp	ing system; and
5	(2)	Inco	rporate into their use of the critical incident
6		plan	ning and mapping system, without limitation:
7		<u>(A)</u>	Evacuation routes and strategies for evacuation;
8		(B)	Alarms and other signals or means of
9			notification;
10		(C)	Plans for sheltering in place; and
11		(D)	Training and strategies for prevention in
12			connection with attacks involving violence.
13	<u>If</u> a	stat	e agency or a political subdivision has its own
14	planning	and m	apping system prior to the establishment of a
15	statewide	crit	ical incident planning and mapping system under
16	this chap	ter,	the state agency or political subdivision may
17	continue	to us	e its own system, unless funds are made available
18	for that	state	agency or political subdivision to update or
19	modify it	s own	system as necessary for inclusion in the
20	statewide	crit	ical incident planning and mapping system.
21	(d)	The	department of public safety shall:

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1	(1)	Pursue any funding that may be available from the				
2		federal government for the development and operation				
3		of a statewide critical incident planning and mapping				
4		system for public schools in this State and for the				
5		distribution of grants to the state agencies and				
6		political subdivisions that participate in the				
7		critical incident planning and mapping system; and				
8	(2)	Pursue monetary gifts, grants, and contributions for				
9		the development and operation of a statewide critical				
10		incident planning and mapping system and for the				
11		distribution of grants to the state agencies and				
12		political subdivisions that participate in the				
13		critical incident planning and mapping system.				
14	<u>(e)</u>	Each state agency and political subdivision that				
15	participates in the critical incident planning and mapping					
16	system shall, on or before July 1, 2010, and on or before July 1					
17	of each year thereafter, submit to the department a progress					
18	report setting forth, in accordance with rules adopted by the					
19	department, the experience of the agency or political					
20	subdivisi	subdivision, as applicable, with respect to its participation in				
21	the critical incident planning and mapping system. The					
22	departmen	t shall summarize the progress reports and submit a

1 report to the legislature no later than twenty days prior to the 2 convening of the 2011 regular session, and each regular session 3 thereafter. 4 (f) After the statewide critical incident planning and 5 mapping system is established pursuant to this chapter, each 6 state agency and political subdivision that participates in the 7 critical incident planning and mapping system shall submit to 8 the department the information required under subsection (b)(1), 9 including any initial or final plan that constructs, modifies, or substantially alters any of the structures or infrastructure 10 11 of a public school in this State. 12 (g) For the purposes of this section, "sheltering in 13 place" means to remain inside a building, room, structure, or other location during an emergency when egress may be impossible 14 15 or when egress may present a more substantial risk than 16 remaining inside the building, room, structure, or other 17 location." 18 SECTION 2.
