A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO TRAFFIC VIOLATIONS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. Section 291-12, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
amended to read as follows:

3 "§291-12 Inattention to driving[-]; mobile telephones. 4 (a) Whoever operates any vehicle without due care or in a 5 manner as to cause a collision with, or injury or damage to, as 6 the case may be, any person, vehicle or other property shall be 7 fined not more than \$500 or imprisoned not more than thirty 8 days, or both, and may be subject to a surcharge of up to \$100 9 which shall be deposited into the trauma system special fund. 10 (b) Whoever operates a vehicle on a public highway while 11 using a mobile telephone that is not equipped and being used as 12 a hands-free mobile telephone shall be fined not more than 13 ; provided that this subsection shall not apply to \$ 14 using a mobile telephone for a medical or safety emergency. It

15 shall be an affirmative defense that the person was using a

16 mobile telephone for the purpose of reporting a medical or

1	safety emergency or to obtain assistance for a medical or safety
2	emergency.
3	For purposes of this subsection:
4	"Hands-free mobile telephone" means a mobile telephone that
5	allows a user to operate the mobile phone without requiring the
6	user to hold or manipulate the mobile telephone by hand.
7	"Mobile telephone" means a device used by persons to access
8	a two-way real time voice telecommunications service provided by
9	a commercial mobile radio service, as defined in Title 47 Code
10	of Federal Regulations section 20.3 as in effect on June 1,
11	<u>1999.</u>
12	"Operates a vehicle" means the person occupies and assumes
13	physical control of the steering mechanism of the vehicle while
14	the engine or motor is running.
15	"Using a mobile telephone" means:
16	(1) Initiating a telephone call by dialing a telephone
17	number;
18	(2) Talking, listening, receiving, or terminating a
19	telephone call; or
20	(3) Configuring the mobile telephone to standby and
21	receive telephone calls."

SECTION 2. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
begun, before its effective date.

4 SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed5 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

6 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
