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A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HOUSING.

	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:
1	PART I
2	FINDINGS AND PURPOSE
3	SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the American
4	Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 combines tax relief and
5	government spending totaling \$787,000,000,000 to jump start the
6	nation's economy. Hawaii will be eligible to receive a portion
7	of this federal funding through formula grants and competitive
8	applications. The legislature further finds that the federal
9	funds could supplement the State's continued efforts to assist
10	the homeless, rehabilitate aging public housing stock, and
11	preserve and build affordable housing.
12	Through the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009,
13	Hawaii is projected to receive:
14	(1) HOME Investment Partnerships Program. \$9,600,000 to
15	enable state and county government, in partnership
16	with community-based organizations, to acquire,

1		construct, and rehabilitate affordable housing and
2		provide rental assistance to poor families;
3	(2)	Public Housing Capital Fund. \$16,300,000 for public
4		housing agencies to address a backlog in capital
5		needs, especially those improving energy efficiency in
6		aging buildings; and
7	(3)	Homelessness Prevention Fund. \$6,200,000 for short-or
8		medium-term rental assistance, first and last months
9		rental payment, or utility payment.
10	The	expanded home buyer tax credit will be available for
11	home purc	hases after December 31, 2008. Hawaii's first-time
12	home buye	rs will benefit from an increase in the current credit
13	from \$7,5	00 to \$8,000, the expiration date has been extended
14	from July	1, 2009, to December 1, 2009, and the repayment
15	requireme	nt eliminated. In addition, the prohibition against
16	combining	the tax credit with mortgage revenue bonds has been
17	lifted.	
18	Hawa	ii will compete for a portion of the \$2,000,000,000 in
19	rental as	sistance for full-year payments to owners receiving
20	section 8	project-based rental assistance, and an additional
21	\$2,000,00	0,000 directed to the Neighborhood Stabilization
22	Program.

3	provided	that the funding amounts are subject to change if the
4	programs	in this Act receive funding through the American
5	Recovery	and Reinvestment Act of 2009.
6		PART II
7		RENTAL HOUSING TRUST FUND
8	SECT	ION 2. Section 247-7, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
9	amended t	o read as follows:
10	"§24	7-7 Disposition of taxes. All taxes collected under
11	this chap	ter shall be paid into the state treasury to the credit
12	of the ge	neral fund of the State, to be used and expended for
13	the purpo	ses for which the general fund was created and exists
14	by law; p	rovided that of the taxes collected each fiscal year:
15	(1)	Ten per cent shall be paid into the land conservation
16		fund established pursuant to section 173A-5;
17	(2)	[Thirty] <u>Fifty</u> per cent shall be paid into the rental
18		housing trust fund established by section 201H-202;
19		and
20	(3)	Twenty-five per cent shall be paid into the natural
21		area reserve fund established by section 195-9;
22		provided that the funds paid into the natural area
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1	rese	erve fund shall be annually disbursed by the
2	depa	artment of land and natural resources in the
3	foll	owing priority:
4	(A)	To natural area partnership and forest
5		stewardship programs after joint consultation
6		with the forest stewardship committee and the
7		natural area reserves system commission;
8	(B)	Projects undertaken in accordance with watershed
9		management plans pursuant to section 171-58 or
10		watershed management plans negotiated with
11		private landowners, and management of the natural
12		area reserves system pursuant to section 195-3;
13		and
14	(C)	The youth conservation corps established under
15		chapter 193."
16	SECTION 3	3. The director of finance is authorized to issue
17	general obliga	tion bonds in the sum of \$25,000,000 or so much
18	thereof as may	be necessary and the same sum or so much thereof
19	as may be nece	essary is appropriated for fiscal year 2009-2010 to
20	be deposited i	nto the rental housing trust fund created in
21	section 201H-2	202, Hawaii Revised Statutes.

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1	SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the rental housing
2	trust fund the sum of \$25,000,000 or so much thereof as may be
3	necessary for fiscal year 2009-2010 for the planning,
4	development, and construction of affordable housing in
5	cooperation with private and nonprofit developers.
6	The sum appropriated shall be expended by the Hawaii
7	housing finance and development corporation for the purposes of
8	this Act.
9	PART III
10	DWELLING UNIT REVOLVING FUND
11	SECTION 5. The director of finance is authorized to issue
12	general obligation bonds in the sum of \$50,000,000 or so much
13	thereof as may be necessary and the same sum or so much thereof
14	as may be necessary is appropriated for fiscal year 2009-2010 to
15	be deposited into the dwelling unit revolving fund created in
16	section 201H-191, Hawaii Revised Statutes.
17	SECTION 6. There is appropriated out of the dwelling unit
18	revolving fund the sum of \$50,000,000 or so much thereof as may
19	be necessary for fiscal year 2009-2010 for housing development
20	programs.

1 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the Hawaii 2 housing finance and development corporation for the purposes of 3 this Act. 4 PART IV 5 PERMITTING AND PROCESSING 6 SECTION 7. There is appropriated out of the general 7 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$500,000 or so much 8 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2009-2010 to assist 9 developers in contracting for third party review and 10 certification, including but not limited to inspections, 11 discretionary permits, and ministerial permits, to expedite the 12 processing and issuance of building permits for affordable 13 housing projects; provided that, in order to qualify for funding 14 under this section, an affordable housing project shall offer 15 not less than forty per cent of all units, whether rental or 16 for-sale, in leasehold or fee simple, at prices or rents that 17 are affordable to persons earning eighty per cent or less of the 18 area median income as determined by the United States Department 19 of Housing and Urban Development. 20 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the Hawaii 21 housing finance and development corporation for the purposes of 22 this Act. 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1	PART V
2	MAINTENANCE, REPAIRS, AND RENOVATIONS
3	SECTION 8. The legislature finds that public housing
4	projects are continuing to deteriorate due to a lack of timely
5	maintenance and repair. As a consequence, housing units are in
6	danger of becoming or have already become uninhabitable.
7	Currently, the public housing authority receives \$1,500,000
8	annually for repair and maintenance; however, these funds are
9	insufficient to keep public housing units in decent, sanitary,
10	and livable conditions.
11	The purpose of this part is to appropriate an additional
12	\$2,000,000 for repair and maintenance to satisfactorily maintain
13	these vital housing resources.
14	SECTION 9. There is appropriated out of the general
15	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$2,000,000 or so much
16	thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2009-2010 for repair
17	and maintenance of public housing projects.
18	The sum appropriated shall be expended by the Hawaii public
19	housing authority for the purposes of this Act.
20	SECTION 10. The director of finance is authorized to issue
21	general obligation bonds in the sum of \$40,200,000 or so much
22	thereof as may be necessary and the same sum or so much thereof SB773 SD1.DOC *SB773 SD1.DOC* *SB773 SD1.DOC*

1	as may be necessary is appropriated for fiscal year 2009-2010
2	for capital improvement projects to repair and renovate public
3	housing.
4	The sum appropriated shall be expended by the Hawaii public
5	housing authority for the purposes of this Act.
6	PART VI
7	SECURITY; PUBLIC HOUSING PROJECTS
8	SECTION 11. The legislature finds that improved safety
9	measures are needed at public housing projects. While the 2007
10	Hawaii state legislature appropriated general funds for public
11	housing security needs, additional funding is required to
12	sufficiently address the arduous security problems plaguing
13	housing projects.
14	The purpose of this part is to continue the work begun in
15	the 2007 regular session by appropriating funds for security in
16	order to protect physical public housing property as well as
17	create a safer environment for public housing tenants and the
18	surrounding community.
19	SECTION 12. There is appropriated out of the general
20	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$1,500,000 or so much
21	thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2009-2010 for

1 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the Hawaii public 2 housing authority for the purposes of this Act. 3 PART VII 4 HOMELESS; SERVICES AND SHELTER 5 SECTION 13. There is appropriated out of the general 6 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$5,300,000 or so much 7 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2009-2010 for 8 outreach or support services, or both, to unsheltered homeless, 9 at-risk homeless, and those residing in homeless facilities, 10 including emergency shelters, pursuant to the purchase of 11 service agreements under chapter 42F, Hawaii Revised Statutes. 12 This appropriation shall be used for the provision of continual 13 operational funds to provide matching funds for shelter plus 14 care grants and supportive housing programs and operational 15 funds for nonprofit agencies to develop affordable housing. 16 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the Hawaii public 17 housing authority for purposes of this Act. 18 SECTION 14. The director of finance is authorized to issue 19 general obligation bonds in the sum of \$32,000,000 or so much 20 thereof as may be necessary and the same sum or so much as may 21 be necessary is appropriated for fiscal year 2009-2010 for 22 homeless facilities, emergency shelters, and transitional SB773 SD1.DOC *SB773 SD1.DOC* *SB773 SD1.DOC*

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1	shelters, as defined by section 356D-121, Hawaii Revised
2	Statutes, on the islands of Oahu and Hawaii.
3	The sum appropriated shall be expended by the Hawaii public
4	housing authority for the purposes of this Act.
5	PART VIII
6	GENERAL
7	SECTION 15. The appropriations made in sections 3, 4, 5,
8	6, 9, 10, 12, 13, and 14 of this Act shall not lapse at the end
9	of the fiscal year for which the appropriation is made; provided
10	that all appropriations that are unencumbered as of June 30,
11	2012, shall lapse as of that date into the appropriate fund.
12	SECTION 16. If any provision of this Act, or the
13	application thereof to any person or circumstance is held
14	invalid, the invalidity does not affect other provisions or
15	applications of the Act, which can be given effect without the
16	invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions
17	of this Act are severable.
18	SECTION 17. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
19	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
20	SECTION 18. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.
