## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HISTORIC PLACES.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. S	ection 708-813, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by amendin	g subsection (1) to read as follows:
3	"(1) A perso	n commits the offense of criminal trespass in
4	the first degree i	f:
5	(a) That per	son knowingly enters or remains unlawfully:
6	(i) In	a dwelling; or
7	(ii) In	or upon the premises of a hotel or apartment
8	bui	lding;
9	(b) That per	son:
10	(i) Kno	wingly enters or remains unlawfully in or upon
11	pre	mises that are fenced or enclosed in a manner
12	des	igned to exclude intruders; and
13	(ii) Is	in possession of a firearm, as defined in
14	sec	tion 134-1, at the time of the intrusion; $[\frac{or}{}]$
15	(c) That per	son enters or remains unlawfully in or upon
16	the prem	ises of any public school as defined in
17	section	302A-101, or any private school, after

1		reasonable warning or request to leave by school
2		authorities or a police officer; provided however,
3		such warning or request to leave shall be unnecessary
4		between 10:00 p.m. and 5:00 a.m.; or
5	<u>(d)</u>	That person enters or remains unlawfully in or upon
6		premises of a property listed on the Hawaii register
7		of historic places after reasonable warning or request
8		to leave that property."
9	SECTION 2. Section 708-820, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is	
10	amended by	y amending subsection (1) to read as follows:
11	"(1)	A person commits the offense of criminal property
12	damage in	the first degree if by means other than fire:
13	(a)	The person intentionally or knowingly damages property
14		and thereby recklessly places another person in danger
15		of death or bodily injury;
16	(b)	The person intentionally or knowingly damages the
17		property of another, without the other's consent, in
18		an amount exceeding \$20,000;
19	(C)	The person intentionally or knowingly damages the
20		property of another during the time of a civil defense
21		emergency proclaimed by the governor pursuant to
22		chapter 128, within the area covered by the civil
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1		defense emergency or during the period of disaster
2		relief under chapter 127; [ <del>or</del> ]
3	(d)	The person intentionally or knowingly damages the
4		agricultural equipment, supplies, or products or
5		aquacultural equipment, supplies, or products of
6		another, including trees, bushes, or any other plant
7		and livestock of another, without the other's consent,
8		in an amount exceeding \$1,500. In calculating the
9		amount of damages to agricultural products, the amount
10		of damages includes future losses and the loss of
11		future production [→]; or
12	<u>(e)</u>	The person intentionally or knowingly damages property
13		on the Hawaii register of historic places or damages
14		property that contributes to a site on the Hawaii
15		register of historic places."
16	SECTION 3. This Act does not affect rights and duties tha	
17	matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were	
18	begun, before its effective date.	
19	SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed	
20	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.	
21	SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.	

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## Report Title:

Historic Places; Trespass; Property Damage

## Description:

Makes the entering or remaining unlawfully on property listed in the Hawaii register of historic places after warning or request to leave, an offense of criminal trespass in the first degree. Makes the intentional or knowing damage to property on the Hawaii register of historic places an offense of criminal property damage in the first degree. (SD1)
