## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO DOGS.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- SECTION 1. Chapter 711, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 1
- 2 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
- 3 and to read as follows:
- "§711- Pit bulls. (1) A person commits the offense of 4
- owning, possessing, or selling a pit bull if the person owns, 5
- 6 possesses, keeps, exercises control over, maintain, harbors,
- 7 transports, or sells in this State any pit bull.
- 8 (2) Owning, possessing, or selling a pit bull is a
- 9 misdemeanor.
- 10 Impoundment and forfeiture of the pit bull pursuant to
- 11 sections 711-1109.1 and 711-1109.2 shall apply to this section.
- 12 As used in this section, "pit bull" means any dog that (4)
- is an American pit bull terrier, American staffordshire terrier, 13
- 14 a staffordshire bull terrier, or any dog displaying the majority
- 15 of physical traits of any one or more of those breeds, or any
- dog exhibiting those distinguishing characteristics which 16
- substantially conform to the standards established by the 17



- 1 American Kennel Club or United Kennel Club for any of those
- 2 breeds. A duly incorporated humane society or a duly
- 3 incorporated society for the prevention of cruelty to animals
- 4 shall maintain a copy of the applicable standards.
- 5 (5) For the purposes of this section, "person" shall not
- 6 include a duly incorporated humane society."
- 7 SECTION 2. Section 711-1109.1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 8 amended by amending subsection (1) to read as follows:
- 9 "(1) If there is probable cause to believe that a pet
- 10 animal is being subjected to treatment in violation of section
- 11 711-1108.5, 711-1109, 711-1109.3, [or] 711-1109.6, or 711- , a
- 12 law enforcement officer, after obtaining a search warrant or in
- 13 any other manner authorized by law, may enter the premises where
- 14 the pet animal is located to provide the pet animal with food,
- 15 water, and emergency medical treatment or to impound the pet
- 16 animal. If after reasonable effort, the owner or person having
- 17 custody of the pet animal cannot be found and notified of the
- 18 impoundment, an impoundment notice shall be conspicuously posted
- 19 on the premises and within seventy-two hours after posting, the
- 20 notice shall be sent by certified mail to the address, if any,
- 21 from which the pet animal was removed."

1 SECTION 3. Section 711-1109.2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended by amending subsection (1) to read as follows: 3 "(1) If any pet animal is impounded pursuant to section 4 711-1109.1, prior to final disposition of the criminal charge 5 under section 711-1108.5, 711-1109, 711-1109.3, [ex] 711-1109.6, 6 or 711- , against the pet animal's owner, any duly incorporated humane society or duly incorporated society for the 7 8 prevention of cruelty to animals that is holding the pet animal 9 may file a petition in the criminal action requesting that the 10 court issue an order for forfeiture of the pet animal to the 11 county or to the duly incorporated humane society or duly 12 incorporated society for the prevention of cruelty to animals prior to final disposition of the criminal charge. 13 14 petitioner shall serve a true copy of the petition upon the 15 defendant and the prosecuting attorney." 16 SECTION 4. This Act shall not be repealed upon the repeal 17 of the amendments to sections 711-1109.1 and 711-1109.2, Hawaii 18 Revised Statutes, pursuant to Act 128, Session Laws of Hawaii 19 2008. Any reenactment of sections 711-1109.1 and 711-1109.2, 20 Hawaii Revised Statutes, on June 30, 2011, shall include the

amendments under this Act to sections 711-1109.1 and 711-1109.2,

Hawaii Revised Statutes.
