A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE HAWAII TOURISM AUTHORITY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 26-34, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 2 amended:
- 3 1. By amending subsection (a) to read:
- 4 "(a) [The] Except as otherwise provided by law, the
- 5 members of each board and commission established by law shall be
- 6 nominated and, by and with the advice and consent of the senate,
- 7 appointed by the governor. Unless otherwise provided by this
- 8 chapter or by law hereafter enacted, the terms of the members
- 9 shall be for four years; provided that the governor may reduce
- 10 the terms of those initially appointed so as to provide, as
- 11 nearly as can be, for the expiration of an equal number of terms
- 12 at intervals of one year for each board and commission. Unless
- 13 otherwise provided by law, each term shall commence on July 1
- 14 and expire on June 30, except that the terms of the chairpersons
- 15 of the board of agriculture, the board of land and natural
- 16 resources, and the Hawaiian homes commission shall commence on
- 17 January 1 and expire on December 31. No person shall be
- 18 appointed consecutively to more than two terms as a member of



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    the same board or commission; provided that membership on any
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    board or commission shall not exceed eight consecutive years."
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         2. By amending subsection (e) to read:
         "(e) Except as otherwise provided by this chapter [\tau] or by
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    law, this section shall apply to every board and commission
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    established by part I, or existing or established after
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    November 25, 1959. All new appointments to any board or
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    commission shall thereafter be made in accordance with this
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    section."
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         SECTION 2. Section 201B-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
    amended by amending subsections (b), (c), (d), and (e) to read
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    as follows:
         "(b) The authority shall be headed by a policy-making
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    board of directors [which] that consists of twelve [public,
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    voting] members[, and four ex officio nonvoting members];
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    provided that:
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              Twelve public, voting members shall be appointed by
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              the governor as provided in section 26-34, except as
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              otherwise provided by law;
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         (2) The twelve public, voting members (1) One member
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              shall be [composed of at least one representative each
              from] nominated and, by and with the advice and
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1		consent of the senate, appointed by each of the mayors
2		of the city and county of Honolulu and the counties of
3		Hawaii, Kauai, and Maui[; the remaining public members
4		shall be appointed at-large];
5	[(3)]	(2) Of the [twelve public, voting] remaining members,
6		[three] four shall be appointed [by the governor from
7		a list of three names submitted for each appointment]
8		by the president of the senate, and [three] four shall
9		be appointed [by the governor from a list of three
10		names submitted for each appointment] by the speaker
11		of the house of representatives; provided that [if
12		fewer than three names are submitted for each
13		appointment, the governor may disregard the list;] the
14		appointments by the president of the senate and the
15		speaker of the house of representatives shall be by
16		adoption of a single house resolution by a majority of

3		no more than three members shall represent, be
4		employed by, or be under contract to any sector of the
5		industry represented on the board; and

7		and speaker of the house of representatives shall
8		coordinate their appointments to ensure the
9		fulfillment of all requirements[; provided that any
10		appointments made after July 1, 2002, shall be made to
11		fulfill the requirements in place when the
12		appointments are made; of paragraph (3); and
13	[-(6)	The director of business, economic development, and
14		tourism, or a designated representative, shall be an
15		ex officio nonvoting member;
16	(7)	The director of transportation, or a designated
17		representative, shall be an ex officio nonvoting
18		member;
19	(8)	The chairperson of the board of land and natural
20		resources, or a designated representative, shall be an
21		ex officio nonvoting member;

1	(9)	The executive director of the state foundation on
2		culture and the arts, or a designated representative,
3		shall be an ex officio nonvoting member; and
4	(10)]	(5) No person who has served as a member of the board
5		of directors of the Hawaii Visitors and Convention
6		Bureau shall be eligible to sit as a public, voting
7		member of the board of directors of the Hawaii tourism
8		authority until at least two years have expired
9		between the person's termination from service on the
10		Hawaii Visitors and Convention Bureau board and the
11		person's appointment to the authority's board of
12		directors.
13	(c)	The public members shall be appointed [by the
14	governo r]	for terms of four years [-]; provided that a member
15	appointed	by a mayor shall hold office for a term to expire at
16	the end o	f the term for which the appointing mayor was elected.
17	A member a	appointed by a mayor may continue in office as a
18	holdover	until a successor is nominated and appointed as
19	provided:	in subsection (b)(1). [Each public member] A member
20	appointed	under subsection (b)(2) shall hold office until the
21	member's	successor is appointed and qualified. The president of
22	the senate	e and the speaker of the house of representatives shall
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    coordinate the terms of all members initially appointed to
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    provide for one half of the terms of the members appointed to
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    expire in two years and one half of the terms of the members
    appointed to expire in four years. Each term shall commence on
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    July 1 and expire on June 30. Section 26-34 shall [be
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    applicable] apply insofar as it relates to the number of terms
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    and consecutive number of years a member may serve on the board.
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         When the legislature is not in session and a vacancy occurs
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    for a member appointed pursuant to subsection (b)(1), which
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    requires the confirmation of the senate, the mayor of the
    respective county shall make the appointment, which shall
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    expire, unless the appointment is confirmed by the senate, at
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    the adjournment sine die of the next regular session of the
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    legislature. When the legislature is not in session and a
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    vacancy occurs for a member appointed pursuant to subsection
    (b) (2), which requires the adoption of a resolution by the
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    senate or house of representatives, the presiding officer of the
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    respective house who is to make the appointment shall make the
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    appointment, which shall expire at the adjournment sine die of
    the next regular session of the legislature unless a resolution
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    is adopted by the respective house as provided in subsection
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    (b)(2).

6	(3)	Measures to address issues affecting airlines, air	
7		routes, and barriers to travel to Hawaii; and	
8	(4)	Programs to perpetuate the cultures of Hawaii and	
9		engage local communities to sustain and preserve the	
10		native Hawaiian culture."	
11,	SECTION 4. After the effective date of this Act, members		
12	of the Hawaii tourism authority board shall continue to hold		
13	office until a successor is appointed as provided in this Act.		
14	SECTION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed		
15	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.		
16	SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
