## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO MOTOR VEHICLES.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the use of electric
 powered motor vehicles supports fuel efficient technologies,
 decreases Hawaii's dependence on imported fuel oils, and
 decreases harmful emissions that contribute to environmental
 decay and global warming.

6 The purpose of this Act is to provide incentives to
7 purchase and use electric powered motor vehicles by allowing
8 these vehicles to travel in high occupancy vehicle lanes.

9 SECTION 2. Section 291C-222, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
10 amended to read as follows:

11 "\$291C-222 Designation of high occupancy vehicle lane.
12 (a) The director of transportation by rules adopted in
13 accordance with chapter 91, and the counties by ordinance, may
14 designate high occupancy vehicle lanes as to roadways under
15 their respective jurisdictions.

16 (b) Signs and other official traffic-control devices that 17 designate high occupancy vehicle lanes shall be placed and 18 maintained to advise drivers of the high occupancy vehicle SB LRB 09-0150.doc

1 requirement and the hours of usage. When the high occupancy 2 vehicle lane also serves as a contraflow lane, the hours of 3 usage as a high occupancy vehicle lane shall be the time when the lane is coned for use as a high occupancy vehicle lane. 4 5 No motor vehicle shall be operated upon these lanes (C) except in conformance with the instructions on the signs and 6 7 other official traffic-control devices. 8 (d) An electric powered motor vehicle may use any high 9 occupancy vehicle lane as provided under this section, 10 regardless of the number of occupants in the vehicle. 11 For the purposes of this section: 12 "Electric powered motor vehicle" means a motor vehicle with 13 an electric motor that derives power from an electric battery or 14 battery pack. [(d)] (e) A motorcycle may use any high occupancy vehicle 15 16 lane, regardless of the number of occupants. 17 [<del>(c)</del> Any] (f) In addition to subsection (d) or (e), any 18 vehicle authorized by rules adopted in accordance with chapter 19 91 may use any high occupancy vehicle lane, regardless of the 20 number of occupants, when the use is determined to enhance 21 public safety and improves traffic conditions."

1 SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed and stricken. New statutory material is underscored. 2

3 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2009, and shall be repealed on January 1, 2011; provided that on December 4 31, 2010, section 291C-222, Hawaii Revised Statutes, shall be 5 reenacted in the form in which it existed on the day before the 6 7 effective date of this Act.
