A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CHILDREN.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The legislature finds that children,			
2	particularly young children, are the most vulnerable during, and			
3	at times victimized by, homelessness. While many children			
4	develop some resiliency to their situation and are able to			
5	overcome the ravages of homelessness, homelessness often leads			
6	to poor health, exposure to violence, poor academic performance,			
7	and a lack of positive social interactions.			
8	The purpose of this Act is to minimize the adverse effects			
9	of homelessness on children by establishing a task force to			
10	coordinate resources to benefit children who are homeless.			
11	SECTION 2. (a) There is established a task force to			
12	coordinate public and private resources to benefit homeless			
13	children.			
14	(b) The president of the senate and the speaker of the			
15	house of representatives shall convene the task force. The task			
16	force shall:

4		(A)	The superintendent of education or the

10		(D)	Four members representing the four counties, with
11			one member appointed by the mayor of each county;
12		(E)	Four members representing not-for-profit
13			organizations that serve Hawaii's homeless
14			families, two appointed by the president of the
15			senate and two appointed by the speaker of the
16			house of representatives;
17		(F)	The chairs of the standing committees of the
18			senate and house of representatives having
19			primary oversight of issues concerning lower
20			education;

1	(G)	The chairs of the standing committees of the
2		senate and house of representatives having
3		primary oversight of issues concerning health;
4	(H)	The executive director of the office of youth
5		services or the executive director's designee;
6	(I)	Two individuals who are homeless, one appointed
7		by the president of the senate and one appointed
8		by the speaker of the house of representatives;
9	(J)	A member representing organizations that provide
10		shelter, street outreach, or transitional living
11		services to runaway, homeless, and street youth;
12		and
13	(K)	A member from the leeward native Hawaiian
14		community.
15	(c) The	task force shall establish findings and develop
16	recommendation	s on how the State can coordinate public and
17	private resour	ces to benefit homeless children.
18	(d) The	task force shall submit an interim report,
19	including any	proposed legislation, to the legislature no later
20	than twenty da	ys prior to the convening of each regular session
21	of 2010, 2011,	and 2012, and shall submit a final report,
22	including its	findings and recommendations and any proposed
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1 legislation, to the legislature no later than twenty days prior 2 to the convening of the regular session of 2013. 3 The task force shall terminate on June 30, 2013. (e) 4 SECTION 3. (a) There is established within the state 5 treasury the kokua na keiki special fund to be administered and 6 expended by the department of human services, and into which 7 shall be deposited: 8 (1)Appropriations made by the legislature; and 9 Any contributions by private entities; (2) 10 provided that the special fund may be established only upon the 11 determination by the department of human services that federal 12 funds are available for the purposes of this Act. 13 The moneys in the special fund shall be used by the (b) 14 department of human services to: 15 Establish and fill a homelessness coordinator (1)16 position; and 17 Establish and fill one support staff position to (2) 18 assist the homelessness coordinator. 19 The moneys in the special fund may also be used by the (C) 20 department of human services to provide grants for innovative 21 programs that benefit homeless children or that help coordinate services for the benefit of homeless children. 22 SB809 SD2.DOC *SB809 SD2.DOC* *SB809 SD2.DOC*

1	(d)	Applications for grants shall be made to the	
2	departmen	t of human services and contain:	
3	(1)	The name of the requesting organization or individual;	
4	(2)	The purpose for the grant;	
5	(3)	The service to be supported by the grant;	
6	(4)	The target group to be benefited;	
7	(5)	The cost of the grant; and	
8	(6)	A statement that the grant shall be used for	
9		activities that are consistent with the purposes of	
10		this Act.	
11	(e)	A grant shall be awarded only if:	
12	(1)	The applicant has applied for or received all	
13		applicable licenses and permits that are required to	
14		conduct the activities or provide the services for	
15		which a grant is awarded;	
16	(2)	The applicant agrees to comply with applicable	
17		federal, state, and county laws;	
18	(3)	The grant shall not be used for purposes of	
19		entertainment or perquisites; and	
20	(4)	The applicant shall indemnify and hold harmless the	
21		department of human services, the State, its officers,	
22		agents, and employees from and against any and all	
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1		claims arising out of or resulting from activities
2		carried out or projects undertaken with funds provided
3		hereunder, and procure sufficient insurance to provide
4		this indemnification if requested to do so by the
5		department of human services.
6	(f)	To receive a grant, an applicant shall:
7	(1)	Agree to make available to the department of human
8		services all records the applicant may have relating
9		to the operation of the applicant's activity,
10		business, or enterprise, to allow the department of
11		human services to monitor the applicant's compliance
12		with the purpose of this Act; and
13	(2)	Establish, to the satisfaction of the department of
14		human services, that sufficient funds are available
15		for the effective operation of the activity, business,
16		or enterprise for the purpose for which the grant is
17		awarded.
18	(g)	Every grant shall be:
19	(1)	Monitored by the department of human services to
20		ensure compliance with this Act and the purposes and
21		intent of the grant; and

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1 (2) Evaluated annually to determine whether the grant 2 attained the intended results in the manner 3 contemplated. 4 Grants made by the department of human services under (h) 5 this Act may be made without regard to chapters 103D and 103F, 6 Hawaii Revised Statutes. 7 SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of available and 8 appropriate federal funds the sum of \$ for fiscal year 9 2009-2010 and the same sum for fiscal year 2010-2011 to be 10 deposited into the kokua na keiki special fund; provided that 11 this section shall only take effect upon a determination by the 12 department of human services that federal funds that may be 13 appropriately expended for the purposes of this Act are 14 available. 15 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department 16 of human services for the purposes of this Act. 17 SECTION 5. There is appropriated out of the kokua na keiki special fund the sum of \$ or so much thereof as may be 18 19 necessary for fiscal year 2009-2010 and the same sum or so much 20 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2010-2011 for the 21 purposes described in section 3; provided that this section 22 shall only take effect upon a determination by the department of SB809 SD2.DOC *SB809 SD2.DOC* *SB809 SD2.DOC*

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1 human services that federal funds that may be appropriately 2 expended for the purposes of this Act are available. 3 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department 4 of human services for the purposes of this Act. 5 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on January 1, 2045; provided that sections 2 and 3 shall be repealed on June 30, 6 7 2013; and provided further that sections 4 and 5 shall take 8 effect on July 1, 2009.
