This bill is intended to restore a necessary statutory provision allowing for presentence mental or medical examination of defendants. On some occasions, it may be helpful to the sentencing court for defendants to undergo a mental or medical examination as part of the judiciary presentence investigation.

In 2005, the statutory provision was repealed as part of the revisions to section 706-603, Hawaii Revised Statutes, in section 4 of Act 112. The original wording of the statutory provision was derived from the Model Penal Code.

The amendments in 2005 to section 706-603 changed the section, making it necessary to create a new section for the restored statutory provision.
