## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO SENTENCING.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 706, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by adding a new section to part I to be appropriately
3	designated and to read as follows:
4	"§706- Presentence mental and medical examination. (1)
5	As used in this section, unless the context otherwise requires:
6	"Conviction" means that a verdict has been rendered by a
7	judge or jury, or a plea of guilty or nolo contendere has been
8	accepted by the court.
9	"Licensed psychologist" means a psychologist licensed under
10	chapter 465 and includes psychologists exempt from licensure
11	under section 465-3(a)(3).
12	(2) Before imposing a sentence, the court may order a
13	defendant who has been convicted of a felony or misdemeanor to
14	submit to mental or other medical observation and examination
15	for a period the court determines to be necessary for the

purpose, but the period shall not exceed the length of

permissible imprisonment. In addition thereto or in the

- 1 alternative, the court may appoint one or more qualified
- 2 psychiatrists, physicians, or licensed psychologists to conduct
- 3 the examination. The examiner or examiners shall be appointed
- 4 from a list of certified examiners as determined by the
- 5 department of health. The report of the examination shall be
- 6 submitted to the court."
- 7 SECTION 2. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
- 8 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
- 9 begun before its effective date.
- 10 SECTION 3. New statutory material is underscored.
- 11 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on January 1, 2046.
