A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CIVIL DEFENSE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. One of the policies and purposes of chapter			
2	128, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is for all civil defense functions			
3	of the State to be coordinated to the maximum extent possible			
4	with the comparable functions of the federal government			
5	(including its various departments and agencies), other states			
6	and localities, and private agencies of every type; so that the			
7	most effective preparation and use may be made of all personnel,			
8	resources, and facilities for dealing with any disaster or			
9	emergency that may occur.			
10	The legislature finds that there is a need to amend the law			
11	regarding the liability of an owner or operator of a hospital,			
12	community-based care home, home-based care home, or healthcare			
13	agency or facility of any type, as well as day care, and			
14	educational institutions, when an owner or operator of these			
15	facilities permits the use of the property for sheltering			
16	persons during disasters and emergencies. The legislature			
17	recognizes that there is a shortage of shelter space in Hawaii

    and that the private industry should be encouraged to assist the
2
    public by providing shelter for those persons who by reason of
3
    existing relationships may already be in these facilities during
4
    disasters and emergencies. Under the current law, it is unclear
5
    whether owners or operators of certain facilities are able to
6
    fully comply with the requirements of section 128-19, Hawaii
7
    Revised Statutes, when providing shelter to persons in their
8
    care, custody, or charge because section 128-19 requires that
9
    shelter be made available without compensation. The purpose of
10
    this Act is to clarify that compensation received by certain
11
    private entities for use of facilities as a private shelter is
12
    not considered compensation for the purposes of section 128-19,
13
    Hawaii Revised Statutes.

         SECTION 2. Section 128-19, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is

    amended to read as follows:

         "§128-19 Immunity from liability of private shelter. (a)
