## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO FEDERAL FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE FOR INDEPENDENT LIVING SERVICES AND CENTERS.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The statewide council on independent living was 2 created by Act 197, Session Laws of Hawaii 1993 (codified as 3 section 348-9, Hawaii Revised Statutes), and placed within the 4 department of human services. 5 Act 84, Session Laws of Hawaii 1995, removed the statewide 6 council on independent living from the department of human 7 services to conform with the 1992 amendment to the federal 8 Rehabilitation Act of 1973, as amended, title 29 United States 9 Code section 796d, which requires states to establish a 10 statewide independent living council to receive federal 11 financial assistance and prohibited a statewide independent 12 living council from being placed within a state agency in order 13 to receive the federal financial assistance. Act 84 retained 14 the statewide council on independent living but made the 15 statewide council on independent living a temporary agency with 16 a repeal date of June 30, 1998, at which time section 348-9,

Hawaii Revised Statutes, was to be reenacted. On June 30, 1998,

- 1 Act 84 was repealed and the statewide council on independent
- 2 living was again administratively placed in the department of
- 3 human services. No other laws were passed after 1998 to remove
- 4 the statewide council on independent living from placement in
- 5 the department of human services.
- 6 Title 29 United States Code section 796d, still requires
- 7 the State to establish a statewide independent living council,
- 8 which still cannot be established as an entity within a state
- 9 agency for the State to be eligible to receive federal financial
- 10 assistance.
- 11 Section 348-9, Hawaii Revised Statutes, was well intended,
- 12 but it does not conform to the federal requirements for a
- 13 statewide independent living council, and has resulted in
- 14 confusion. Repealing section 348-9, Hawaii Revised Statutes,
- 15 will abolish the nonconforming statewide council on independent
- 16 living.
- 17 The purposes of this Act are to repeal section 348-9,
- 18 Hawaii Revised Statutes, to abolish the statewide council on
- 19 independent living established within the department of human
- 20 services in section 348-9, Hawaii Revised Statutes, to conform
- 21 to federal law, which prohibits a statewide independent living
- 22 council from being placed within a state agency, and to thereby

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    allow for compliance with the federal requirement for the
