A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO COPIES IN THE BUREAU OF CONVEYANCES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. Section 502-21, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
amended to read as follows:

"§502-21 Recording of plans unlawful. It shall not be 3 lawful for the registrar to accept for record any plan of land, 4 whether attached to, made a part of, or independent of, any 5 deed, certified copy of judgment of condemnation, or other 6 instrument; to the end and purpose that there shall be no plans 7 recorded in the record books, but in substitution therefor there 8 shall be a single method of filing plans in the archives of the 9 bureau of conveyances; provided that where sketches, blueprints, 10 or plans of land of a size not larger than 8 1/2 inches by 14 11 inches which legibly reproduces under photographic, electronic, 12 13 or electrostatic methods are attached to instruments and made a 14 part thereof by reference to the same in the instrument, the registrar may record the same in the record books by means of 15 the photographic recorder, on payment of the fee as provided in 16 17 section 502-25."

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SECTION 2. Section 502-22, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
amended to read as follows:

"§502-22 Copies of plans furnished by registrar. 3 The registrar shall furnish, when so requested, copies of any map or 4 plan filed in accordance with sections 502-17 to 502-21, duly 5 certified by the registrar's seal of office, upon payment of the 6 7 fee hereinafter mentioned. In addition, the registrar may 8 authorize the department of accounting and general services to 9 furnish, when so requested, copies of such maps or plans, subject to the payment of fees applicable to maps or plans 10 11 furnished by the registrar. These copies of maps or plans may 12 be furnished in photographic, electronic, or electrostatic form." 13

14 SECTION 3. Section 502-26, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 15 amended to read as follows:

"§502-26 Copies of instruments, certificates. 16 The registrar, when applied to, shall furnish an attested copy of 17 any instrument or document recorded in the registrar's office, 18 or of any fact appearing upon the registrar's records. 19 The 20 registrar may also issue nonattested documents or portions of any instrument or document recorded in the registrar's office [-]21 22 in photographic, electronic, or electrostatic form. The

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registrar may issue certificates of search or incumbrance when
personnel is available for the making of the certificate."
SECTION 4. Section 502-92, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
amended to read as follows:

"§502-92 Copies of old records. The registrar shall 5 prepare photographic, electronic, or electrostatic copies of the 6 7 records and record books in the bureau of conveyances which by reason of age, usage, or otherwise are in such condition that 8 9 they can no longer be conveniently used or consulted without danger of destruction thereof, and certify to the correctness of 10 The certified copies, and prints made from them such copies. 11 and similarly certified, may be read in evidence with the same 12 force and effect as the original instrument. The correctness of 13 such copies is not conclusive but may be rebutted. All such 14 records and record books from which the copies are made shall be 15 deposited with the department of accounting and general services 16 in its public archives. The registrar may convert into 17 electronic form information or documents recorded before the 18 registrar began to record electronic documents." 19

20 SECTION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed21 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

DEPARTMENT:

TITLE:

A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO COPIES IN THE BUREAU OF CONVEYANCES.

PURPOSE: To clarify the authority of the Bureau of Conveyances (Bureau) on accepting copies of documents.

MEANS: Amend sections 502-21, 502-22, 502-26, and 502-92, Hawaii Revised Statutes.

JUSTIFICATION: Presently, the Bureau is required to archive documents in photographic or electrostatic format. This requires documents to be stored in microfilm format.

> This bill will allow for faster return of the documents to the public due to the elimination of the step to microfilm the documents in lieu of a cost efficient digital format.

Impact on the public: Timely availability of documents as a result of using digital format.

Impact on the department and other agencies: The Bureau will be able to eliminate the step of microfilming documents for archiving, which will assist in a faster and more effective operation.
