A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO TARO.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that Act 211, Session 2 Laws of Hawaii 2008, recognized the need to develop non-genetic-3 modification-based solutions to protect taro from disease and 4 insects on a statewide basis. Prior to Act 211, a dialogue 5 among the State's department of agriculture, taro farmers from 6 each island, researchers and representatives from the University 7 of Hawaii, the Hawaii Farm Bureau, and the office of Hawaiian 8 affairs had produced a joint report recommending the formation 9 of a taro security and purity task force to guide policy and 10 prioritize research for the protection of taro in Hawaii. Act 11 211 established the taro security and purity task force; 12 assigned it numerous objectives ranging across such areas as 13 policy development, incentives for taro security, public 14 education, training, and development of a grant program; and 15 placed it within the office of Hawaiian affairs for 16 administrative purposes.

Act 211 required the task force to submit to the

1 its progress no later than twenty days prior to the convening of 2 the regular session of 2009 and (2) a final report summarizing 3 its program, the results achieved, actual expenditures, and 4 recommended legislation no later than twenty days prior to the 5 convening of the regular session of 2010.

6 Conference Draft 1 of Senate Bill No. 2915, the bill that 7 evolved into Act 211, contained an appropriation of \$325,000 in 8 state general fund revenues for fiscal year 2008-2009, to be 9 expended by the office of Hawaiian affairs to achieve the 10 objectives of the task force and to be matched dollar for dollar 11 by the office of Hawaiian affairs. However, the governor in 12 approving the bill vetoed the \$325,000 appropriation in its 13 entirety. As a result, the task force, although it has been 14 formed and has made some progress, has faced a major financial 15 obstacle to fully carrying out its legislative mandate.

16 The purpose of this Act is to help ensure that the taro 17 security and purity task force reaches its full potential by 18 appropriating funds for its operation.

19 SECTION 2. Act 211, Session Laws of Hawaii 2008, is 20 amended by amending section 3 to read as follows:
