## SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

## REQUESTING A REPORT ON THE FEASIBILITY OF CREATING A VOCATIONAL/TECHNICAL EDUCATION LEARNING CENTER AT HONOLULU COMMUNITY COLLEGE.

1 WHEREAS, Honolulu Community College is a member of the 2 American Association of Community Colleges and the Western 3 Association of Schools and Colleges and has been continuously 4 and fully accredited since 1970 by the Accrediting Commission 5 for Community and Junior Colleges and the Western Association of 6 Schools and Colleges; and

WHEREAS, the Main Campus of Honolulu Community College, a 8 9 short distance from the heart of downtown Honolulu, occupies over twenty acres on Dillingham Boulevard in the Kalihi-Palama 10 area, and the College also has facilities near Honolulu 11 International Airport for the Aeronautics Maintenance and 12 Commercial Aviation programs, automotive and heavy equipment 13 shops on Kokea Street, and the Marine Education and Training 14 15 Center on Sand Island; and

17 WHEREAS, Department of Education Learning Centers are 18 designed to provide public school students and their parents 19 with greater academic choice by creating distinctive, 20 specialized, and excellent programs within public education; and 21

22 WHEREAS, each Learning Center, typically established within 23 existing Department of Education schools, is organized around a 24 single theme or focus area; and 25

WHEREAS, Campbell, Leilehua, and Waialua High Schools on
Oahu; Lahainaluna High School on Maui; and Waiakea High School
on the island of Hawaii are currently designated as
Vocational/Technical Education Learning Centers in the State of
Hawaii; and

1 WHEREAS, Honolulu Community College is the only community college in the State that offers programs in Aeronautics 2 Maintenance Technology, Commercial Aviation, Refrigeration and 3 Air Conditioning Technology, Sheet Metal and Plastics 4 Technology, and Welding Technology; and 5 6 WHEREAS, Honolulu Community College is the only community 7 college on the island of Oahu that offers programs in 8 Architectural, Engineering and CAD Technologies; Carpentry 9 Technology; Diesel Mechanics Technology; Electrical Installation 10 and Maintenance Technology; Fire and Environmental Emergency 11 Response; and Welding Technology; and 12 13 14 WHEREAS, students receiving credit from Honolulu Community College may transfer directly to the University of Hawaii at 15 Manoa, the University of Hawaii at Hilo, and the University of 16 17 Hawaii - West Oahu to complete their four-year baccalaureate degree; and 18 19 WHEREAS, Honolulu Community College also has transfer 20 agreements with other universities in Hawaii and serves as a 21 gateway to over two thousand universities and colleges across 22 the United States; and 23 24 WHEREAS, students at Honolulu Community College receive 25 instruction in small classes taught by well-credentialed faculty 26 who are dedicated to excellence in teaching; now, therefore, 27 28 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-fifth 29 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2010, the 30 31 House of Representatives concurring, that the Department of Education and Honolulu Community College are requested to 32 convene a task force to discuss and report on the feasibility of 33 creating a Department of Education Vocational/Technical 34 Education Learning Center at Honolulu Community College; and 35 36 37 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the report include: 38 39 (1)A working definition for "vocational/technical education" that would distinguish the goals of the 40 proposed Honolulu Community College 41 Vocational/Technical Education Learning Center from 42 the focus of other Department of Education Learning 43 44 Centers; 2010-1180 SCR SMA.doc

1 2 The facilities needs, personnel needs, student (2) accountability, and budgetary conditions and 3 requirements that must be met for the proposed 4 Honolulu Community College Vocational/Technical 5 Education Learning Center to be established; 6 7 8 (3) A plan for the curriculum to be offered at the 9 proposed Honolulu Community College Vocational/Technical Education Learning Center; 1011 (4)Whether credits earned at the proposed Honolulu 12 Community College Vocational/Technical Education 13 Learning Center could be counted as both Department of 14 Education and community college credits; 15 16 Whether and how the contact hours for the classes  $(5)^{1}$ 17 would satisfy Department of Education or community 18 college accreditation requirements; and 19 20 (6) The possibility of expanding the Early Admit, Running 21 Start, and other similar programs to allow students 22 who might attend the proposed Honolulu Community 23 College Vocational/Technical Learning Center to take 24 advantage of their time on campus and participate in 25 college course offerings; and 26 27 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Education and 28 Honolulu Community College provide administrative support to the 29 task force and submit the findings and recommendations of the 30 task force no later than twenty days prior to the convening of 31 the Regular Session of 2011; and 32 33 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 34 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Superintendent of 35 Education, Chairperson of the Board of Education, and Chancellor 36 of Honolulu Community College. 37 38 39 OFFERED BY: Noman Salamot 40
