## SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

## REQUESTING THE IMPLEMENTATION OF TWELVE-MONTH PRINCIPAL PERFORMANCE CONTRACTS BY THE 2011-2012 SCHOOL YEAR.

WHEREAS, principals' contracts were extended from ten-month 1 2 to twelve-month terms to provide time to work towards improving students' performance; and 3 4 5 WHEREAS, in January 2005, the Board of Education voted unanimously to accept the report "Implementing Principal 6 Performance Contracts in Hawaii Public Schools" with the 7 8 recommendation that principals should work under a contract type known as performance contracting, with a system of rewards and 9 sanctions based on performance standards that need to be 10 specific and include measurable objectives such as student 11 assessments, attendance, and discipline rates; and 12 13 WHEREAS, the principal performance contract system was 14 piloted in selected central district schools, and a Department 15 of Education report on the outcomes of this pilot states that 16 using evaluation information is critical to improving student 17 learning outcomes and system performance; and 18 19 WHEREAS, through accrediting agencies and federal 20 21 legislation such as the Race to the Top program, educators at all levels are being required to assume responsibility for 22 student performance and progress, with the emphasis shifting 23 toward student learning and assessment; and 24 25 WHEREAS, to ensure that reform efforts continue, 26 accountability is critical and principals and teachers need to 27 take responsibility for improving learning in schools and 28 classrooms by reviewing data and applying professional skills to 29 adjust priorities, processes, and methodologies to ensure 30 student progress; now, therefore, 31



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BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-fifth 1 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2010, the 2 House of Representatives concurring, that the Department of 3 Education and the Hawaii Government Employees Association are 4 5 requested to complete negotiations on incentives and sanctions and begin implementation of twelve-month principal performance 6 contracts by the 2011-2012 school year; and 7

9 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Education is requested to submit a report to the Legislature no later than 10 twenty days prior to the convening of the 2011 Regular Session 11 on the status of implementation of twelve-month principal 12 13 performance contracts, including but not limited to the names and numbers of schools at each level that have implemented the 14 15 program, the outcomes of the program with respect to improvements in student performance, the types of incentives 16 awarded, the types of sanctions imposed on principals, and an 17 overall evaluation of the effectiveness of the program; and 18 19

20 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 21 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Superintendent of Education and the Hawaii Government Employees Association. 22 23

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
