SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE ESTABLISHMENT OF A WORKING GROUP TO DEVELOP A COMPREHENSIVE PLAN TO IMPROVE AWARENESS OF AND STRENGTHEN SUPPORT FOR PERSONS WITH DYSLEXIA.

WHEREAS, dyslexia is a learning disability that is 1 neurobiological in origin and characterized by difficulties with 2 accurate and fluent word recognition, poor spelling, and poor 3 decoding abilities, resulting in problems with reading 4 comprehension and reduced reading experience that impede the 5 growth of vocabulary and background knowledge; and 6

WHEREAS, students with dyslexia may experience difficulties 8 in skills such as reading, spelling, writing, and speaking; and 9 10

WHEREAS, between ten and twenty per cent of Americans are affected by dyslexia or other reading disabilities; and 12 13

WHEREAS, a significant number of students in Hawaii, 14 including those with dyslexia, read below basic reading levels 15 and experience literacy challenges, which include difficulties 16 with language (spoken or written) or reading (in phonemic 17 awareness, phonics, vocabulary, fluency, or comprehension), or 18 difficulties with one or more of the basic neurobiological or 19 psychological processes involved in understanding or using 20 language (spoken or written) that may result in an imperfect 21 ability to listen, think, speak, read, write, spell, or perform 22 mathematical calculations; and 23

WHEREAS, an improved awareness of and support for persons 25 with dyslexia and improved training of educators (including 26 teachers, education administrators, education officials, and 27 other employees providing instruction, assessment, or special 28 services for general, compensatory, gifted, or special 29 education; therapy; and training of students under the 30 jurisdiction of the Department of Education) will help students, 31 including those with dyslexia, obtain the necessary instruction, 32

1 support, skills, and resources to increase their success in 2 school; now, therefore,

4 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-fifth 5 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2010, the House of Representatives concurring, that the Department of 6 7 Education and the University of Hawaii are requested to establish a working group to develop a comprehensive plan to 8 improve awareness of and strengthen support for persons with 9 dyslexia, partly through the provision of training for educators 10 in the State by the 2012-2013 school year, where training 11 includes technical assistance and training in the early 12 identification and assessment of dyslexia, and on the direct, 13 14 explicit, and systematic research-based instruction of students 15 in oral and written language; and

17 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the comprehensive plan is 18 requested to include but not be limited to the following areas: 19 20 (1) Increasing awareness of dyslexia; 21 22 (2) Early assessment and identification of students with

- (2) Early assessment and identification of students with literacy challenges, including dyslexia;
- (3) A tiered continuum of intensity for research-based instructional intervention within the Response to Intervention model;
- (4) Evidence-based progress monitoring that provides students, parents, and educators with data on student performance and improvements, and that uses this data in evaluations and decisions for instructional changes;
- (5) Research-based interventions to address the needs of 35 students with literacy challenges, including dyslexia, 36 consistent with guidelines established by the 37 Partnership For Reading, comprising the National 38 Institute of Child Health and Human Development, the 39 National Institute for Literacy, and the United States 40 Department of Education, based on findings of the 41 42 National Reading Panel;
