SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

	REQUESTING THE UNITED STATES CONGRESS TO AUTHORIZE THE ESTABLISHMENT OF A NATIONAL MONUMENT FOR WOMEN IN WASHINGTON, D.C., TO RECOGNIZE AND HONOR THE LEADERSHIP CONTRIBUTIONS OF AMERICA'S WOMEN.
1	WHEREAS, the 2009 International Women's Leadership
2	Conference, hosted by the State of Hawaii, inspired and
3	empowered women to deepen their understanding of what it means
4	to be a woman leader; and
	to be a woman reader; and

6	WHEREAS, the women presenters at the International Women's
7	Leadership Conference were chosen for their exemplary
8	leadership, including business and government executives,
9	development organization leaders, and authors from all over the
10	world; and
11	
12	WHEREAS, the International Women's Leadership Conference
12	raised the awareness of women in business, government service,
14	and countless other professions to higher sights, higher
15	standards, and exciting and attainable future goals; and
16	
17	WHEREAS, particularly for women in Hawaii, the
18	International Women's Leadership Conference helped them to
19	realize their potential and collective strength to perform
20	successfully in leadership positions in their own communities;
21	and

23	WHEREAS, the International Women's Leadership Conference
24	focused on developing strong leadership skills in women by
25	encouraging each conference participant to explore ideas and
26	reach out in home communities to make a difference, day by day;
27	and

29	WHEREAS, today's women shall bequeath their talents,
30	education, wisdom, leadership skills, and the fruits of their
31	successes to the coming generations, encouraging and enabling

women, especially young professionals and students, to reach for 1 2 the stars; and 3 4 WHEREAS, in addition to private and government sector women 5 leaders, the military has had its share of women leaders from the Revolutionary War to the present who have performed 6 7 courageously in a wide variety of duties; and 8 9 WHEREAS, women in the United States have taken leadership roles in every major field of endeavor, often while 10 simultaneously supporting and nurturing families; and 11 12 13 WHEREAS, a November 20, 2000, article in Business Week Online, stated that, by and large, studies show that women 14 executives, when rated by their peers, subordinates, and bosses, 15 16 score higher than their male counterparts on a wide variety of measures -- from producing high-quality work to goal-setting to 17 mentoring employees; and 18 19 WHEREAS, pursuant to Title 40 United States Code Section 20 21 8903, Congressional authorization is necessary to establish commemorative works, defined under section 8902 to include 22 memorials in the District of Columbia, to "reflect a consensus 23 of the lasting national significance of the subjects involved" 24 25 (40 U.S.C. § 8901); and 26 27 WHEREAS, a national monument in Washington, D.C., dedicated to recognizing and honoring the leadership contributions of 28 29 America's women is an ideal means of enshrining the past achievements of women leaders and inspiring future women 30 leaders; now, therefore, 31 32 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-fifth 33 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2010, the 34 House of Representatives concurring, that the United States 35 Congress is requested to authorize the establishment of a 36 37 National Monument for Women in Washington, D.C., to recognize 38 and honor the leadership contributions of America's women; and 39 40
