SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE CONVENING OF A JOINT PUBLIC AND PRIVATE SECTOR TASK FORCE TO ASSESS AND IDENTIFY WHICH CORE SERVICES SHOULD BE PROVIDED BY THE GOVERNMENT, THE APPROPRIATE LEVEL OF GOVERNMENT TO PROVIDE THOSE SERVICES, AND WHICH SERVICES MAY BE BETTER PROVIDED BY THE PRIVATE SECTOR OR THROUGH PUBLIC-PRIVATE PARTNERSHIPS.

1 WHEREAS, the Legislature adopted House Concurrent 2 Resolution No. 76, H.D. 1, S.D. 1 in 2009, establishing a Task 3 Force on Reinventing Government to examine the existing 4 operations and organization of Hawaii's state government and 5 recommend ways to make Hawaii's government more efficient; and 6

7 WHEREAS, the Task Force on Reinventing Government was 8 formed in October 2009 and gathered together a varied group of 9 government leaders, state agency and department heads, community 10 leaders, nonprofit organization leaders, and business executives 11 from around the State; and

WHEREAS, the Task Force formed subcommittees to examine six primary departments and issue areas and tasked each subcommittee with formulating up to five recommendations relating to each issue area; and

18 WHEREAS, on January 4, 2010, the Task Force as a whole
19 adopted recommendations of the subcommittees as the
20 recommendations of the Task Force; and

WHEREAS, one of the recommendations of the Task Force on Reinventing Government is to identify government functions that are appropriate to be performed at the state level (and identifying which state agency) or county level, to identify functions that would be appropriately performed through publicprivate partnerships, and to realign government accordingly; and 28



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1 WHEREAS, the Legislature finds that there are duplicative 2 state and county functions that result in government waste and inefficiency and several core services of government that may be 3 better provided by the private sector or through public-private 4 5 partnerships; and 6 7 WHEREAS, the Legislature agrees with the finding of the Task Force on Reinventing Government that government functions 8 9 should be realigned if functions are shifted in a way that increases government efficiency; now, therefore, 10 11 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-fifth 12 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2010, the 13 House of Representatives concurring, that the Senate President 14 and the Speaker of the House of Representatives are requested to 15 convene a joint public and private sector task force to assess 16 and identify: 17 18 Which services that are currently provided by the 19 (1)government are core services that should continue to 20 be provided by the government; 21 22 Which level of government, state or county, should (2)23 provide each of those core services; and 24 25 Which core services could be better or more (3) 26 efficiently provided by the private sector or through 27 public-private partnerships; and 28 29 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Senate President and the 30 Speaker of the House of Representatives appoint members of the 31 task force to include but not be limited to representatives of: 32 33 The executive, legislative, and judiciary branches of (1)34 state government; 35 36 37 (2) Hawaii, Kauai, and Maui county governments and the city and county of Honolulu government; and 38 39 The private and nonprofit sector, 40 (3) 41 who have significant experience or success working for their 42 respective government agencies, in partnership with government 43



1 agencies, or in a private capacity for the provision of services traditionally considered to be core government services; and 2 3 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the members of the task force 4 select a chairperson from among themselves, and the chairperson 5 is requested to convene task force meetings; and 6 7 8 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that in determining which sector, public or private, would be better suited to provide certain 9 core governmental services, the task force is requested to use 10 performance-based metrics and measurements in assessing benefits 11 to the public and the achievement of service goals; and 12 13 14 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the task force report its 15 findings and recommendations, including any proposed legislation, to the Legislature no later than twenty days prior 16 17 to the convening of the Regular Session of 2011; and 18 19 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Legislative Reference 20 Bureau is requested to assist the task force in drafting the 21 task force's recommendations and proposed legislation; and 22 23 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Governor, Senate 24 President, Speaker of the House of Representatives, 25 Administrative Director of the Courts, and mayors of the 26 27 counties of Kauai, Maui, Hawaii, and the City and County of 28 Honolulu. 29 30 31 OFFERED BY: l.lle Trun Clallen
