SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE ESTABLISHMENT OF A SELF-HELP HOUSING TRUST FUND ADVISORY BOARD TO PREPARE FOR THE ADMINISTRATION AND OPERATION OF A SELF-HELP HOUSING TRUST FUND.

1 WHEREAS, the Legislature finds that self-help housing 2 programs such as Habitat for Humanity and Hawaii Self-Help 3 Housing offer low- and moderate-income families an opportunity 4 to own their own homes by using "sweat equity" to build their 5 homes; and

7 WHEREAS, when families build their own homes their
8 financial stability greatly improves, the children do better in
9 school, and the families rarely move, which often provides
10 increased employment opportunities; and

12 WHEREAS, self-help housing is a hand up from circumstances 13 that frequently lead to homelessness, and a number of self-help 14 housing homeowners in Hawaii had been homeless prior to building 15 their homes; and

WHEREAS, although the State has opened many new shelters to address the rapid rise in homelessness, a common problem that remains is a lack of places where people can stay during their transition from a shelter or other transitional housing; and

22 WHEREAS, self-help housing offers a dignified alternative 23 to some of the families transitioning out of homelessness and 24 provides homeless prevention to families who are living in 25 precarious circumstances; and

WHEREAS, self-help housing is not only more cost effective than shelters or rental housing, but it also provides economic and community development in neighborhoods and is one of the best sources of asset building with very low-, low-, and moderate-income households; and

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WHEREAS, there are eight existing organizations in Hawaii 1 that have assisted in building more than one thousand self-help 2 homes: Habitat for Humanity, Self-Help Housing Corporation of 3 Hawaii, Hawaii Island Community Development Corporation, Hawaii 4 Intergenerational Community Development Association, the 5 Consuelo Foundation, Molokai Home Ownership Made E-ffordable 6 Corporation, Hawaii County Economic Opportunity Council, and 7 Lokahi Pacific; and 8 9 WHEREAS, the average cost of a house built in Hawaii with 10 the self-help method varies by program but generally falls in 11 the range of \$80,000 to \$110,000; and 12 13 WHEREAS, self-help housing programs attempt to build as 14 much as possible on leasehold land from the Department of 15 Hawaiian Home Lands, the State, or the counties; are sometimes 16 offered land or money to buy land by developers who are required 17 to meet a certain threshold of affordable homes; and may buy 18 inexpensive lands when available; and 19 20 WHEREAS, the Legislature finds that establishing a 21 dedicated source of funding through a self-help housing trust 22 fund would provide grant funding for technical assistance and 23 construction materials and possibly grants or low- or zero-24 interest loans for predevelopment costs and the purchase of land 25 to build on; now, therefore, 26 27 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-fifth 28 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2010, the 29 House of Representatives concurring, that the Hawaii Housing 30 Finance and Development Corporation is requested to establish a 31 Self-Help Housing Trust Fund Advisory Board to prepare for the 32 administration and operation of a self-help housing trust fund 33 34 by: 35 Identifying potential target groups and clientele to (1)36 whom loans or grants should be made to promote the 37 development of self-help housing in the State; 38 39 (2) Developing criteria for selecting recipients of grants 40 and loans from the proposed self-help housing trust 41 42 fund; 43

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Self-Help Housing Trust 5 Fund Advisory Board is requested to submit a report of its 6 findings and recommendations, including proposed legislation, to 7 the Legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening 8 of the Regular Session of 2011; and 9

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Hawaii Housing Finance and 11 12 Development Corporation provide administrative support to the Self-Help Housing Trust Fund Advisory Board; and 13 14

15 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Self-Help Housing Trust Fund Advisory Board be dissolved upon the adjournment sine die 16 of the 2011 Regular Session of the Legislature; and 17 18

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 19 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Executive Director 20 of the Hawaii Housing Finance and Development Corporation, 21 Habitat for Humanity, Self-Help Housing Corporation of Hawaii, 22 23 Hawaii Island Community Development Corporation, Hawaii Intergenerational Community Development Association, the 24 Consuelo Foundation, Molokai Home Ownership Made E-ffordable 25 Corporation, Hawaii County Economic Opportunity Council, and 26 Lokahi Pacific. 27
