SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF BUSINESS, ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT, AND TOURISM TO PROVIDE INFORMATION TO THE LEGISLATURE ON THE CONSTRUCTION AND USE OF CELL TOWERS.

WHEREAS, cell towers have been growing in number in the 1 2 State; and 3 WHEREAS, cell towers expand coverage for mobile phones and 4 5 electronic devices for businesses and individuals; and 6 7 WHEREAS, in remote locations of the State, especially on 8 the neighbor islands, wireless service coverage is intermittent, unreliable, and in some cases non-existent; and 9 10 WHEREAS, due to the State's mountainous terrain and 11 12 volcanic topography, as well as the separation of the State by the Hawaiian islands, wireless mobile communication devices are 13 more cost effective and efficient than traditional wired 14 technology; and 15 16 WHEREAS, cell towers may transmit microwaves or other 17 frequencies with varying wavelengths, which can be hazardous to 18 humans if directed towards populous areas; and 19 20 WHEREAS, in some residential communities in the State, cell 21 towers are unsightly and ruin ocean and mountain views for many 22 residents; and 23 24 WHEREAS, while the installation of cell towers are 25 necessary to increase the State's communication capabilities, 26 residents have concerns over the location of towers in 27 residential neighborhoods; now, therefore, 28 29 30 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-fifth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2010, the 31

1 House of Representatives concurring, that the Department of 2 Business, Economic Development, and Tourism is requested to 3 provide information to the Legislature on cell towers in the State, including: 4

(1)Any federal, state, or county laws, rules, and regulations that apply to the location, construction, and operation of cell towers; and

The types of services provided by cell towers and the (2) area of service that the tower provides; and
