SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE FORMATION OF A JOINT POVERTY REDUCTION TASK FORCE.

1 WHEREAS, the Legislature finds that it is in the public 2 interest to pursue the common good whereby all families and 3 individuals in Hawaii have improved access to economic and 4 educational opportunities that help families achieve 5 self-sufficiency and financial security while reducing the 6 number of Hawaii residents living in poverty; and

WHEREAS, poverty has social and economic costs for children 8 and families, communities, and the State. Children living in 9 poverty often experience lower academic achievement and 10 increased health and behavioral problems. These problems often 11 continue into adulthood, resulting in greater social and 12 economic costs to society, including increased crime rates, 13 health problems, and negative economic impacts estimated to cost 14 15 the United States \$500,000,000,000 in lost earnings each year; and 16

18 WHEREAS, more and more middle-class Hawaii families are 19 living from paycheck to paycheck, especially in these very 20 difficult economic times; and

22 WHEREAS, more states are recognizing that reducing poverty 23 by addressing the needs of low- and moderate-income families is 24 a critical economic development issue; and

WHEREAS, reducing poverty requires strategic, integrated, and comprehensive approaches that create opportunities for families to achieve economic success, including creating quality jobs, providing work supports, promoting greater collaboration with the private sector, and implementing targeted tax policies; now, therefore,



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BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-fifth 1 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2010, the 2 House of Representatives concurring, that a Poverty Reduction 3 Task Force be created to: 4 5 Assess current state policies and practices, along 6 (1)with evidence-based solutions utilized in other 7 states, that promote economic opportunity and poverty 8 9 reduction; and 10 (2)Develop a strategic, integrated, and comprehensive 11 plan to expand economic opportunities in Hawaii to 12 13 reduce, by at least fifty per cent by 2020, the number of Hawaii residents, including children and families, 14 15 living in poverty; and 16 17 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Task Force consist of ten members of the Legislature as follows: 18 19 Five members of the House of Representatives, three of 20 (1)whom shall be appointed by the Speaker of the House of 21 Representatives and two of whom shall be appointed by 22 the minority leader of the House of Representatives; 23 24 and 25 (2) Five members of the Senate, three of whom shall be 26 27 appointed by the President of the Senate and two of whom shall be appointed by the minority leader of the 28 Senate; and 29 30 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that each year, the Speaker of the 31 32 House of Representatives and the President of the Senate shall jointly designate one member of the Task Force to serve as 33 34 chairperson of the task force. The first chairperson shall be a member of the House of Representatives. Thereafter, the 35 36 position of Task Force chairperson shall alternate between the House of Representatives and the Senate; and 37 38 39 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that each member of the Task Force 40 serve a two-year term; provided that the Speaker of the House of Representatives and the President of the Senate shall jointly 41 select five of the initial members to serve one-year terms. 42 43 Initial appointments to the Task Force shall be made by



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August 1, 2010. Members may serve for unlimited consecutive 1 terms; and 2 3

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the members of the Task Force 4 5 serve without compensation and shall not be reimbursed for any expenses incurred in the performance of their duties; and 6

8 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Task Force meet during each interim at least four times and additionally as convened by the 9 10 chairperson; and

12 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Task Force appoint ' 13 subcommittees to advise the Task Force in completing its duties. The chairperson shall select subcommittee members from 14 stakeholder groups that shall include but are not limited to 15 relevant executive branch agencies, the counties, business and 16 labor organizations, educational organizations, advocates, and 17 individuals directly affected by the work of the Task Force. 18 The chairperson of the Task Force shall appoint a member of the 19 Task Force to chair each subcommittee; and 20

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Task Force:

(1)Assess current state policies and practices that promote economic opportunity and poverty reduction and, before December 31, 2011, develop a strategic, integrated, and comprehensive plan that will expand economic opportunities in Hawaii and, by 2020, reduce by at least fifty per cent the number of Hawaii residents, including children and families, living in poverty;

Study and evaluate best policies and practices that: (2)

- Build family assets and financial stability; (A)
- (B) Increase preschool through postsecondary educational opportunities;
- Expand the work force with quality jobs that meet (C) private sector needs;
- (D) Make work pay through the use of fair and sustainable targeted tax policies; and
