SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEVELOPMENT OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION MANDATING THE SIZE AND EXTENT OF A MANAGED CARE PLAN'S SPECIALTY NETWORK.

WHEREAS, the Legislature has given broad authority to the 1 Department of Human Services to "administer the medical 2 assistance programs for eligible public welfare and other 3 medically needy individuals by establishing standards, 4 5 eligibility, and health care participation rules, payment methodologies, reimbursement allowances, systems to monitor 6 7 recipient and provider compliance"; and 8 WHEREAS, a type of medical assistance program developed by 9 the Department of Human Services are the managed care programs 10 such as "Hawaii QUEST" and "QUEST Expanded Access", in which 11 Medicaid health care services are provided to clients through 12 13 their health plan; and 14 WHEREAS, there are reports that the two health plans to 15 16 whom the Department of Human Services have awarded contracts under the QUEST Expanded Access programs do not have adequate 17 networks of primary care providers; and 18 19 20 WHEREAS, concerns arose that the State lacked adequate 21 assurances from the two health plans that the plans had the ability to deliver services; and 22

24 WHEREAS, these concerns have led to lawsuits in the federal
25 courts to block the contract awards under the QUEST Expanded
26 Access programs; and

WHEREAS, it appears that rather than delegating those
functions to the Department of Human Services, the Legislature
needs to directly establish those standards, eligibility, and
health care participation rules, payment methodologies,



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reimbursement allowances, systems to monitor recipient and 1 2 provider compliance; and 3 WHEREAS, a source of precedent is California's Knox-Keene 4 5 Health Care Service Plan Act of 1975, as amended, one of whose purposes is to ensure that subscribers and enrollees are able to 6 access and receive health and medical services rendered in a 7 8 manner providing continuity of care; and 9 10 WHEREAS, under the California legislation, a Knox-Keene license is issued to health care service plans to assure the 11 public that these plans meet certain minimum standards; now, 12 13 therefore, 14 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-fifth 15 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2010, the 16 House of Representatives concurring, that the Governor is 17 requested to develop proposed legislation to mandate the size 18 and extent of a managed care plan's specialty network based upon 19 the California managed care law known as the "Knox-Keene Health 20 21 Care Service Plan Act of 1975, as amended"; and 22 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Governor is requested to 23 direct the participation and assistance of any appropriate 24 agencies and personnel within the executive branch needed to 25 26 develop the proposed legislation; and 27 28 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Governor and the 29 30 Director of Human Services. 31 32 OFFERED BY: John Mon Will Type Clarence & Nichib 33
