## SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY TO REQUIRE IN ITS CONTRACTS THAT INCARCERATED NATIVE HAWAIIANS BE FREE TO PRACTICE THEIR NATIVE HAWAIIAN RELIGION AS WELL AS ONE OTHER FAITH.

WHEREAS, freedom to practice religion is guaranteed under Article I, Section 4 of the Hawaii Constitution, which states, "No law shall be enacted respecting an establishment of religion, or prohibiting the free exercise thereof, or abridging the freedom of speech or of the press or the right of the people peaceably to assemble and to petition the government for a redress of grievances"; and

9 WHEREAS, after western contact, many Hawaiian ali'i
10 converted to Christianity, while also practicing their Hawaiian
11 religion and engaging in Hawaiian cultural and spiritual
12 practices; and

14 WHEREAS, today, many Native Hawaiians continue to practice 15 two religions--their Hawaiian religion as well as another 16 religion, such as Christianity or Buddhism; and

18 WHEREAS, Native Hawaiians who have been incarcerated in 19 out-of-state facilities have been forced to choose one religion 20 that they are allowed to practice; and

22 WHEREAS, the federal Religious Land Use and 23 Institutionalized Persons Act, Title 42 United States Code 24 Chapter 21C, prohibits the imposition of burdens on the ability 25 of prisoners to worship; and

WHEREAS, Title 42 United States Code Section 2000cc-1
states that "No government shall impose a substantial burden on
the religious exercise of a person residing in or confined to an
institution . . . unless the government demonstrates that

imposition of the burden on that person . . . is in furtherance of a compelling governmental interest; and . . . is the least restrictive means of furthering that compelling governmental interest"; now, therefore, 5

6 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-fifth 7 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2010, the House of Representatives concurring, that the Department of 8 Public Safety is requested to require in its new contracts, and 9 to amend its existing contracts to require, that incarcerated 10 11 Native Hawaiians be allowed to practice their Native Hawaiian 12 religion as well as one other religion, subject to reasonable 13 health, safety, and administrative concerns; and 14

15 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Public Safety 16 is requested to report to the Legislature on the implementation 17 of the requested contract provisions no later than twenty days 18 prior to the convening of the Regular Session of 2011; and 19

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Public Safety is requested to include in its report a copy of the language used in the requested contract provisions; and

24 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 25 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Governor, the 26 Director of Public Safety, the Chair of the Senate Committee on 27 Public Safety and Military Affairs, the Chair of the House 28 Committee on Public Safety, and the Attorney General.
