SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE ESTABLISHMENT OF AN ADVISORY COMMITTEE TO MAKE RECOMMENDATIONS REGARDING THE CREATION OF A HAWAII ALL-PAYER HEALTH CLAIMS DATABASE FOR THE PURPOSE OF TRANSPARENT PUBLIC REPORTING OF HEALTH CARE INFORMATION.

1 WHEREAS, according to the State Scorecard published in 2007 2 by the Commonwealth Fund, Hawaii ranked number one among the 3 states in health system performance and is a leader in improving 4 and reforming its health system; and

6 WHEREAS, Hawaii is always seeking to improve the quality of 7 health care provided; and

9 WHEREAS, all-payer claims databases provide information 10 necessary to determine utilization patterns and rates, identify 11 gaps in needed disease prevention and health promotion, assist 12 with benefit design and planning, establish clinical guideline 13 measurements related to quality, safety, and continuity of care; 14 and

17 claims databases and three more states are currently developing
