SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION TO ESTABLISH A TASK FORCE TO MAKE RECOMMENDATIONS FOR AN EDUCATIONAL PROGRAM FOR HIGH SCHOOL ATHLETIC COACHES AND TRAINERS TO AVOID AND MINIMIZE INJURIES TO HIGH SCHOOL ATHLETES.

WHEREAS, athletic competition and sporting events have long
 been a favored extracurricular activity for many of the youth of
 Hawaii; and

5 WHEREAS, there have been many more opportunities for girls 6 and young women to participate in these various athletic and 7 sporting activities recently, when compared to the past; and 8

9 WHEREAS, in addition to practicing the older more
10 traditional sports at a higher level of expertise and
11 competence, there has been a plethora of offerings of new and
12 different types of sports; and

WHEREAS, in addition to the continued popularity of longtime favorites like football, basketball, baseball, and track, other sports such as soccer, volleyball, boys' and girls' wrestling, girl's softball and basketball, swimming, water polo, and diving have increased in popularity, and many schools have added surfing, golf, paddling, cheerleading, and other offerings to their sports programs; and

WHEREAS, many of these newer sports and disciplines require a higher level of expertise and knowledge on the coaching and training levels; and

26 WHEREAS, unfortunately, but inevitably, the higher 27 participation in sporting activities by high school youth has 28 also raised the incidence of injuries, which are sometimes 29 serious and permanent; and 30



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WHEREAS, to the extent practicable, these sports injuries 1 should be avoided, limited, and minimized; and 2 3 WHEREAS, with proper training, knowledge, and vigilance on 4 5 the part of coaches, trainers, and athletic department personnel, many sports injuries can be kept to a minimum or 6 avoided altogether; now, therefore, 7 8 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-fifth 9 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2010, the 10 House of Representatives concurring, that the Department of 11 Education is requested to establish a task force with the 12 objective of creating a program to educate, train, and assist 13 high school coaches, trainers, and athletic departments to avoid 14 and minimize injuries to high school athletes; and 15 16 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Legislature requests that 17 the task force include but not be limited to: 18 19 The Superintendent of Education or the (1)20 Superintendent's designated representative; 21 22 The Executive Director of the Charter School (2)23 Administrative Office or the Executive Director's 24 designated representative, who may be a member of the 25 Charter School Review Panel or an athletic director of 26 a charter school; 27 28 (3) One athletic director to represent: 29 30 The Big Island Interscholastic Federation, Kauai (A) 31 Interscholastic Federation, and Maui 32 Interscholastic League; 33 34 The Oahu Interscholastic Association; and (B) 35 36 The Interscholastic League of Honolulu; (C) 37 38 One high school coach to represent: (4) 39 40 The Big Island Interscholastic Federation, Kauai (A) 41 Interscholastic Federation, and Maui 42 Interscholastic League; 43 44

11 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 12 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Chairperson of the Board of Education, Superintendent of Education, Executive 13 Director of the Charter School Administrative Office, Athletic 14 Director of the University of Hawaii at Manoa, Executive 15 16 Director of the Hawaii High School Athletic Association, and Executive Directors of the Oahu Interscholastic Association, 17 Interscholastic League of Honolulu, Big Island Interscholastic 18 19 Federation, Kauai Interscholastic Federation, and Maui Interscholastic League. 20

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
