SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

URGING THE GOVERNOR TO PROPERLY FUND THE SMALL BUSINESS REGULATORY REVIEW BOARD UNDER THE DEPARTMENT OF BUSINESS, ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT, AND TOURISM TO SUPPORT HAWAII'S SMALL BUSINESSES.

1 WHEREAS, the Small Business Regulatory Review Board ("the 2 Board") acts as the watchdog for small businesses within state 3 government; and

5 WHEREAS, the Board's role is to review state administrative 6 rules or county ordinances that may adversely affect small 7 businesses and recommend to the Legislature or the county 8 council or mayor, as the case may be, that the state or county 9 agencies should review and modify overly burdensome rules or 10 ordinances and evaluate state or county agencies' responsiveness 11 to small business; and

WHEREAS, the Board is dedicated to the success of the
State's small businesses, as well as improving relationships
with state and county departments, and has been an instrumental
voice within the small business community; and

18 WHEREAS, the Board has done an effective and efficient job 19 for the State in generating revenue, advertising, and cutting 20 regulatory red tape for small businesses; and

WHEREAS, many small business owners volunteer their time and are dependent upon the Board and the Department of Business, Economic Development, and Tourism's staff for support and assistance with fulfilling their responsibilities; and

WHEREAS, in order to continue to support Hawaii's many
small businesses, the Board needs to have a stable home, staff,
and budget for its efforts, which are vital for the small
business community; and

1 2 WHEREAS, the position of Small Business Advocate was a 3 crucial liaison between the Board and its many members; and 4 5 WHEREAS, the Board is currently housed within the Department of Business, Economic Development, and Tourism; and 6 7 8 WHEREAS, the shortage of staffing in the Department of 9 Business, Economic Development, and Tourism and budget cuts have 10 resulted in the elimination of the full-time Small Business 11 Advocate; and 12 13 WHEREAS, the duties of the Small Business Advocate have since been assumed by an already lean staff in an attempt to 14 15 continue the work of the Board in assisting Hawaii's small 16 business community; and 17 18 WHEREAS, the Department of Business, Economic Development, 19 and Tourism's reductions of the Board's staffing and resources and its threatened reductions in funding the relatively small 20 costs of transportation to meetings and the printing and 21 distribution of mandated reports severely undermine the Board's 22 mission to assist Hawaii small business owners in doing business 23 in the State; and 24 25 WHEREAS, shifting resources away from the Board and 26 elimination of the Small Business Advocate position have 27 crippled the only viable mechanism to assist Hawaii's small 28 business community; and 29 30 WHEREAS, Governor Linda Lingle has proclaimed that our 31 32 State is "open for business"; now, therefore, 33 34 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-fifth 35 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2010, the House of Representatives concurring, that the Legislature 36 37 strongly urges the Governor to reconsider her position on 38 whether the Small Business Regulatory Review Board is or is not 39 a core function of the Department of Business, Economic Development, and Tourism and to provide an adequate level of 40 funding sufficient to allow the Board to operate, function, and 41 address the needs of Hawaii's small businesses; and 42 43
