SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE ESTABLISHMENT OF A CLEAN AND SOBER HOME AND HALFWAY HOUSE TASK FORCE.

1 WHEREAS, clean and sober homes and halfway houses provide a 2 means for persons to return to the community through support in 3 a home-like environment without the rigid structure of a 4 therapeutic care facility or therapeutic living program; and 5

6 WHEREAS, many persons being released from incarceration
7 need the support of a home environment while trying to deal with
8 the stressors of reintegrating back into society while
9 maintaining sobriety; and

WHEREAS, community residents have expressed concerns over the legal operation of such homes in their immediate vicinity and their compliance with all state and county laws; and

15 WHEREAS, the needs and concerns of the community must be 16 tempered with the needs of the individuals requiring support; 17 now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-fifth
Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2010, the
House of Representatives concurring, that the Department of
Health is requested to establish a clean and sober home and
halfway house task force to address the following issues:

- Establishing clear occupancy requirements of clean and sober homes and halfway houses (facilities);
- (2) Develop a plan of accountability for these facilities to ensure compliance with occupancy and other requirements; in developing the plan the task force shall review the need for or appropriateness of regulation of these facilities, as well as the most appropriate practices regarding regulation; and

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BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the task force report to the 1 2 Legislature on the scope and nature of the accountability plan for clean and sober homes and halfway houses, the process by 3 which the houses will be monitored, the way in which concerns of 4 the community members are balanced with the concerns of those 5 requiring the support of the homes, and how the homes will be 6 7 regulated short of direct governmental oversight; and

9 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the task force submit to the 10 Legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of the Regular Session of 2011, a report on the findings and 11 recommendations of the task force and any proposed legislation 12 that may be necessary to effectuate those recommendations; and 13 14

15 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the President of the 16 Senate, the Speaker of the House of Representatives, Director of 17 18 Health, the Director of the City and County of Honolulu Department of Planning and Permitting, the Director of the 19 County of Hawaii Department of Planning, the Director of the 20 21 County of Maui Department of Planning, the Director of the County of Kauai Department of Planning, and the Chair and 22 Administrator of the Hawaii Paroling Authority. 23
