## SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE ESTABLISHMENT OF A CLEAN AND SOBER HOME AND HALFWAY HOUSE TASK FORCE.

WHEREAS, clean and sober homes and halfway houses provide a means for persons to return to the community through support in a home-like environment without the rigid structure of a therapeutic care facility or therapeutic living program; and

WHEREAS, many persons being released from incarceration need the support of a home environment while trying to deal with the stressors of reintegrating back into society while maintaining sobriety; and

WHEREAS, community residents have expressed concerns over the legal operation of such homes in their immediate vicinity and the compliance of such homes with all state and county laws; and

WHEREAS, the needs and concerns of the community must be tempered with the needs of the individuals requiring support; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-fifth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2010, the House of Representatives concurring, that the Department of Health is requested to establish a clean and sober home and halfway house task force to address the following issues:

- (1) Establishing a clear, legal definition of "clean and sober home";
- (2) Establishing clear occupancy requirements for clean and sober homes and halfway houses (facilities);
- (3) Developing a plan of accountability for these facilities to ensure compliance with occupancy and

other requirements; in developing the plan the task 1 2 force shall review the need for or appropriateness of regulation of these facilities, as well as the most 3 appropriate practices regarding regulation; and 4 5 (4)Community and advocate education; and 6 7 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that in considering the foregoing issues that the task force balance community concerns with the 9 needs of individuals requiring clean and sober homes and halfway 10 houses; and 11 12 13 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Health is requested to chair and convene the task force, which shall 14 include: 15 16 (1)17 The directors of each of the county planning departments or the directors' designees; 18 19 (2) The Director of Health or the Director's designee; 20 21 (3) The Chair of the Hawaii Paroling Authority or the 22 Chair's designee; 23 24 (4)Homeless advocates, as determined by the convener; 25 26 27 (5) Representation from clean and sober homes and halfway houses, as determined by the convener; 28 29 Legislative representatives, as determined by the (6) 30 31 convener; 32 Legal representatives, as determined by the convener, (7) 33 to address issues such as discrimination; and 34 35 Others, as appropriate, as determined by the convener; (8) 36 and 37 38 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that all relevant agencies, 39 including but not limited to the Hawaii Paroling Authority, 40 consult with the appropriate county agencies, as well as the 41

legal representatives of the task force on any issues of

discrimination, to ensure that clients are only referred to

clean and sober homes and halfway houses that meet the zoning

requirements and definitions under section 46-4, Hawaii Revised Statutes, the Federal Fair Housing Act, Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act, Titles II and III of the the Americans with Disabilities Act, and other laws providing housing opportunities and protections for people with disabilities; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the task force report to the Legislature on the scope and nature of the accountability plan for clean and sober homes and halfway houses, the process by which the houses will be monitored, the way in which concerns of the community members are balanced with the concerns of those requiring the support of the homes, and how the homes will be regulated short of direct governmental oversight; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the task force submit to the Legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of the Regular Session of 2011, a report on the findings and recommendations of the task force and any proposed legislation that may be necessary to effectuate those recommendations; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the President of the Senate, the Speaker of the House of Representatives, the Director of Health, the Director of the City and County of Honolulu Department of Planning and Permitting, the Director of the County of Hawaii Planning Department, the Director of the County of Maui Department of Planning, the Director of the County of Kauai Planning Department, and the Chair and Administrator of the Hawaii Paroling Authority.
