SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

SUPPORTING THE ESTABLISHMENT OF A REGIONAL OCEAN COUNCIL FOR HAWAII AND THE SURROUNDING ECONOMIC ENTERPRISE ZONE THAT EMPHASIZES STAKEHOLDER AND PUBLIC PARTICIPATION.

WHEREAS, twenty federal agencies, including the 1 Environmental Protection Agency; US Army Corps of Engineers; 2 Department of Agriculture; Natural Resources Conservation 3 Service; Department of Health and Human Services; Fish and 4 5 Wildlife Service; National Parks Service; and the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration currently administer one 6 hundred forty laws affecting the nation's fresh and salt water 7 8 resources, with little coordination among them; and 9

10 WHEREAS, the myriad of numerous federal agencies having 11 jurisdiction over fresh and salt water creates confusion and 12 results in policies and actions that can harm the overall health 13 of our island ecosystems and oceans; and

15 WHEREAS, the increasing demands on our oceans threatens the 16 fragile health of marine ecosystems; and

WHEREAS, if poorly planned or managed:

(1) Prime fishing grounds may be irreparably harmed;

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26 27 (2) Fishing access may be threatened; and

(3) Ocean recreation, developing aquaculture, building wind, wave and tidal energy facilities all have the potential to come into spatial conflict; and

WHEREAS, President Barack Obama assembled an Interagency Ocean Policy Task Force to recommend a comprehensive policy to protect and restore ocean, Great Lakes, and Pacific Island ecosystems; and 32



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1 WHEREAS, a public meeting was held in Honolulu in September 2 2009 where over three hundred individuals voiced approval: 3 (1) 4 Of a regional process of protection and restoration of water resource; and 5 6 7 (2) To support extending overarching efforts to all of our aquatic ecosystems and the multiple agencies that care 8 9 for them; and 10 WHEREAS, hundreds of invasive species choke our reefs, 11 costing the region hundreds of millions of dollars per year in 12 tourism and fish replenishment; and 13 14 WHEREAS, bottom-dwelling invasive fish out-compete native 15 sport fish for food which harms the sport-fishing industry; and .16 17 WHEREAS, the degradation wetland areas and harmful algae 18 blooms harms our recreational and sport fishing economy; and 19 20 WHEREAS, the regional implementation of a comprehensive 21 national ocean policy could provide a major economic benefit to 22 restore efforts to provide a short-term economic boost, while 23 revitalizing traditional, cultural and commercial activities, 24 25 like fishing and tourism which pay long-term dividends; now, therefore, 26 27 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-fifth 28 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2010, the 29 House of Representatives concurring, that the Legislature 30 requests President Obama to establish by Executive Order a 31 national policy to protect, maintain and restore the health of 32 33 marine ecosystems, and provide a guaranteed, steady source of funding for ocean and coastal conservation and management in 34 order to implement the new policy, ensure it is carried out by 35 the federal government and, to the extent possible, by the 36 37 states, through comprehensive, science-based, including traditional knowledge, and precautionary management of marine 38 39 resources; and 40 41 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Legislature supports the establishment of a Regional Ocean Council for Hawaii and the 42 surrounding economic enterprise zone that emphasizes stakeholder 43 and public participation where the planning process would be 44



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1 fully transparent and participatory, requiring frequent and 2 robust stakeholder engagement throughout all steps of the 3 process in development, adoption, implementation, adaptation, 4 and evaluation; and

6 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Congress is requested to 7 robustly fund this effort; and

9 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 10 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the President of the 11 United States, Hawaii's congressional delegation, and the 12 Governor. 13
