SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

URGING THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION AND THE HAWAII HIGH SCHOOL ATHLETIC ASSOCIATION TO CONSIDER THE ADDITION OF SURFING TO THE SPORTS RECOGNIZED BY THE HAWAII HIGH SCHOOL ATHLETIC ASSOCIATION.

WHEREAS, currently the following sports are recognized by the Hawaii High School Athletic Association: basketball, baseball, softball, volleyball, bowling, air riflery, cheerleading, cross country, football, canoe paddling, soccer, swimming and diving, wrestling, golf, judo, tennis, track and field, and water polo; and

WHEREAS, in May 2004, the Board of Education voted 9-0 that 8 surfing could be added to this list of recognized sports, and 9 approved Board of Education Policy 2180, which "recognizes that 10 surfing, or he'e nalu, has been a part of Hawaii's history since 11 ancient times. Surfing is recognized for its long-standing 12 historical and cultural roots and significance to Hawaii. 13 Surfing is the official individual sport of the State. The 14 Board of Education approves surfing as a high school sport. The 15 Department of Education shall adopt regulations to implement 16 surfing as a high school sport."; and 17

19 WHEREAS, in addition, surfing is a sport that would meet 20 the requirements of Title IX of the Patsy T. Mink Equal 21 Opportunity in Education Act, which grants equal opportunity in 22 sports to female and male athletes; and 23

24 WHEREAS, to date, however, surfing has not attained the
25 status of other interscholastic sports, and the Department of
26 Education has expressed concerns regarding costs and liability,
27 and surfing remains a club level activity; and

29 WHEREAS, after several years of club level competition in 30 public schools, the Department now has available specific cost



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information and data related to any liability issues that may 1 2 have arisen; now, therefore, 3 4 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-fifth 5 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2010, the House of Representatives concurring, that the Department of 6 7 Education and the Hawaii High School Athletic Association are urged to consider the addition of surfing to the sports 8 recognized by the Hawaii High School Athletic Association; and 9 10 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Education 11 12 shall assist in this effort by conducting: 13 14 (1)A review of Board of Education Policy 2180 and any 15 regulations adopted by the Department of Education to implement surfing as a high school sport, pursuant to 16 the requirements of Policy 2180; 17 18 A review of all public school surf clubs, including: 19 (2)20 A listing of all surf clubs, the date of each 21 (A) 22 club's founding, and numbers of students involved 23 annually; 24 Surf club policies and requirements for students 25 (B) and coaches, and an assessment of any differences 26 in policies and requirements among surf clubs; 27 28 (C) Budgets or other financial data relevant to costs 29 of surf club participation, including any 30 competitive event costs; and 31 32 Any liability concerns or issues encountered by (D) 33 34 surf clubs: 35 Projected costs of adding surfing as a recognized 36 (3) interscholastic sport in public schools; and 37 38 39 (4)A timetable for implementation in public schools; and 40 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Education 41 42 shall report its findings and recommendations to the Legislature 43 no later than twenty days prior to the convening of the Regular 44 Session of 2011; and



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2 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 3 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Superintendent of 4 Education and the Executive Director of the Hawaii High School 5 Athletic Association.
