SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

EXPRESSING SUPPORT FOR LOCAL ACCOUNTABILITY OF DRUG FORMULARIES AND DRUG PRIOR AUTHORIZATION POLICIES.

1 WHEREAS, some Hawaii insurance plans are now outsourcing 2 determination of drug formularies and drug prior authorization policies to out-of-state pharmacy benefit managers; and 3 4 5 WHEREAS, many of these policies are unreasonable and 6 administratively burdensome for doctors, pharmacies, and patients; and 7 8 WHEREAS, out-of-state pharmacy benefit managers typically 9 10 have no accountability to Hawaii physicians, pharmacists, and patients for the adverse effects of their policies; and 11 12 WHEREAS, the severe administrative burdens of unreasonable 13 14 pharmacy policies are driving Hawaii physicians to limit acceptance of health insurance plans with such policies, which 15 16 often affects patient access to appropriate care; now, therefore. 17 18 19 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-fifth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2010, the 20 21 House of Representatives concurring, that the Legislature supports the maintenance of locally-based pharmacy and 22 therapeutics committees which are empowered to make decisions on 23 drug formulary and drug prior authorization policies of all 24 health insurance plans doing business in Hawaii, including those 25 under contract with Hawaii Med-QUEST. At least two members of 26 each committee should be representatives from the Hawai'i 27 Employer-Union Health Benefits Trust Fund and an additional 28 29 seventy per cent of membership should be comprised of Hawaiilicensed physicians and pharmacists who are actively engaged in 30 the practice of medicine or pharmacy within the State; and 31 32
