## SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

URGING THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION TO ALLOW VACANT CLASSROOMS TO BE USED BY CHARTER SCHOOLS.

WHEREAS, Act 14, Special Session Laws of Hawaii 2008, 1 2 required the Department of Education to submit annual reports identifying vacant classrooms for conversion into early learning 3 4 facilities; and 5 6 WHEREAS, the Department has identified in its December 2009 7 annual report that eighty vacant public school classrooms are available; and 8 9 10 WHEREAS, these eighty classrooms are located in various public elementary and middle schools on Oahu, Maui, Hawaii, and 11 Kauai; and 12 13 14 WHEREAS, these classrooms are at schools such as Aliiolani Elementary School, Kalihi-Kai Elementary School, Wahiawa Middle 15 School, Waianae Intermediate School, Kailua Intermediate School, 16 Kapaa Middle School, Haiku Elementary School, and Keaau Middle 17 18 School; and 19 20 WHEREAS, the report also indicates that it would cost approximately \$7,204,000 to convert these eighty classrooms for 21 early learning uses; and 22 23 24 WHEREAS, there is increased demand for public charter 25 schools and a lack of public charter school facilities; and 26 WHEREAS, there were over 2,800 students on waitlists who 27 were unable to enroll in public charter schools during the 2008-28 29 2009 school year due to a lack of adequate capacity to accommodate them, according to the Charter School Administrative 30 31 Office; and

1 WHEREAS, some public charter schools do not have conventional classrooms and must use tents, shipping containers, 2 3 trailers, and other make-shift structures as classrooms; and 4 WHEREAS, the need for public charter school facilities is 5 as important as the need for early learning facilities; and 6 7 WHEREAS, some of the eighty vacant classrooms may not be 8 9 located in areas where early learning facilities are in demand, 10 but may be appropriate locations for public charter school classrooms; and 11 12 WHEREAS, the cost of converting vacant classrooms to early 13 learning facilities are likely to cost more than providing the 14 15 vacant classrooms for public charter school use; now, therefore, 16 17 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-fifth 18 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2010, the 19 House of Representatives concurring, that the Department of 20 Education prioritize a portion of the eighty vacant classrooms 21 for use by public charter schools; and 22 23 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Education and 24 the Charter School Administrative Office shall coordinate and 25 allow the use of vacant school classrooms by public charter 26 schools; and 27 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a list of vacant classrooms to 28 29 be set aside for public charter schools be prepared promptly and this list be provided to the Twenty-Fifth Legislature before it 30 31 adjourns in May 2010; and 32 33 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Department of 34 Education and the Charter School Administrative Office. 35 36 37 38 OFFERED BY: 39 40 BY REQUEST

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
