## SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING A STUDY TO RECOMMEND STATUTORY AMENDMENTS TO ADDRESS THE SAFE AND PROPER OPERATION OF BICYCLES, MOPEDS, TWO-SEAT MOPEDS, SEGWAYS, HYBRID BICYCLES, AND POWERFUL MOPEDS.

1 WHEREAS, the rising cost of petroleum-derived fuels has 2 caused people in Hawai'i to seek alternative modes of 3 transportation that are less dependent on petroleum-derived 4 fuels; and

6 WHEREAS, traditional bicycles that are powered solely by
7 human muscle power may not be an attractive transportation
8 alternative, particularly for commuters who have relatively long
9 distances to travel; and

WHEREAS, advancements in technology have made it possible to design and manufacture bicycles with electric motors and batteries to either supplement or to fully drive bicycles, making it possible for riders to cover longer distances, such as with hybrid bicycles that incorporate new technology and are very similar in size and weight to traditional bicycles; and

18 WHEREAS, the Segway and two-seat mopeds are also very 19 popular and are regularly seen on roadways and streets; and 20

21 WHEREAS, mopeds are becoming increasingly powerful with 22 some capable of reaching a speed of forty-five miles per hour; 23 and

WHEREAS, chapter 291C, Hawaii Revised Statutes, relating to the statewide traffic code defines "bicycle", "moped", "motor scooter", and "electric personal assistive mobility device" (Segway), but there is no statutory definition for hybrid bicycle, Segway, or two-seat moped, and existing definitions for bicycle, moped, and motor scooter are outdated; and 31

WHEREAS, the statutes are silent on the safe and permitted 1 2 street use of two-seat mopeds, Seqways, hybrid bicycles, and powerful mopeds; and 3 4 5 WHEREAS, the streets and roadways in the State vary considerably in width and congestion, two important factors in 6 the safe operation of traditional bicycles, mopeds, two-seat 7 mopeds, Segways, hybrid bicycles, and powerful mopeds; and 8 9 10 WHEREAS, a comprehensive study to be coordinated by the 11 Department of Transportation and involving the transportation departments of each county, as well as interested stakeholders, 12 13 is necessary to recommend changes to current laws in order to accommodate the safe and proper operation of bicycles, mopeds, 14 15 two-seat mopeds, Segways, hybrid bicycles, and powerful mopeds; 16 and 17 18 WHEREAS, the Department of Transportation has recommended 19 such a study in testimony before the Senate Committee on Transportation, International and Intergovernmental Affairs: 20 21 now, therefore, 22 23 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-fifth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2010, the 24 House of Representatives concurring, that the Department of 25 Transportation is requested to coordinate a study with the 26 27 transportation department of each of the respective counties and with interested stakeholders to recommend changes to current 28 laws in order to accommodate the safe and proper operation of 29 bicycles, mopeds, two-seat mopeds, Segways, hybrid bicycles, and 30 31 powerful mopeds; and 32 33 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of 34 Transportation is requested to report to the Legislature no later than twenty days prior to commencement of the Regular 35 Session of 2011 with findings, recommendations, and proposed 36 legislation; and 37 38 39
