## SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE AUDITOR TO CONDUCT A FOLLOW-UP AUDIT OF THE MANAGEMENT OF STATE BOATING FACILITIES BY THE DIVISION OF BOATING AND OCEAN RECREATION OF THE DEPARTMENT OF LAND AND NATURAL RESOURCES.

WHEREAS, small boat harbors and boating facilities are part
 of the State's ocean recreation and coastal areas programs
 established in Chapter 200, Hawaii Revised Statutes, and are
 managed by the Department of Land and Natural Resources'
 Division of Boating and Ocean Recreation (Boating Division); and

7 WHEREAS, the proper operation and maintenance of small boat
8 harbors allows the public to benefit from the State's natural
9 resources by engaging in recreational boating, commercial and
10 personal fishing, and maritime-related business operations; and

12 WHEREAS, residents and visitors alike use boating 13 facilities to participate in ocean-based activities such as 14 yacht races, canoe regattas, ocean swimming, and surfing and 15 board sailing contests; and

WHEREAS, inadequate management of state boating facilities
has been a recurring problem, as cited in Auditor Report No.
01-09, "Audit of the Management of State Boating Facilities by
the Department of Land and Natural Resources"; and

WHEREAS, the Auditor's audit report of 1993 and its followup audit report and audit report of 1998 also attest to the problem of inadequate management, which changed little in the 2001 or 2006 audit reports; and

WHEREAS, the Boating Division's mismanagement and neglect has deteriorated boating facilities to the point where their continued use threatens public safety; and 30

WHEREAS, of all the State's small boat harbors, perhaps the 1 2 best known is Ala Wai Harbor in Honolulu; and 3 WHEREAS, the Ala Wai Harbor facilities are in effect 4 5 dysfunctional and are causing the State to lose fee revenues; and 6 7 8 WHEREAS, the Ala Wai Harbor facilities, like many of the 9 State's other harbors, need major repairs; and 10 11 WHEREAS, the 2001 Auditor's report also found that the 12 Boating Division lacked adequate controls to ensure the accuracy 13 and integrity of its financial affairs, such as determining the 14 cost of operating its boating facilities; and 15 16 WHEREAS, in response to the 2001 Auditor's report, the 17 Legislature enacted Act 285, Session Laws of Hawaii 2001, 18 codified as section 200-19, Hawaii Revised Statutes, to allow 19 for private financing of small boat harbor improvements by execution of a capital advancement contract between the Board of 20 Land and Natural Resources and a private party; and 21 22 WHEREAS, Act 259, Session Laws of Hawaii 2001, appropriated 23 the sum of \$2,000,000 for fiscal year 2001-2002 and the sum of 24 25 \$3,000,000 for fiscal year 2002-2003 for repair and maintenance 26 of small boat harbor facilities; and 27 28 WHEREAS, Act 41, Session Laws of Hawaii 2004, appropriated the sum of \$9,000,000 for fiscal year 2004-2005 for improvements 29 at various existing boating facilities throughout the State and 30 other berthing and shore facilities including boat ramps; and 31 32 33 WHEREAS, Act 178, Session Laws of Hawaii 2005, appropriated the sum of \$5,000,000 for fiscal year 2005-2006 for improvements 34 35 at various boating facilities; and 36 WHEREAS, Act 213, Session Laws of Hawaii 2007, appropriated 37 the sum of \$1,840,000 for fiscal biennium 2007-2009 for 38 39 improvements at various boating facilities; and 40 41 WHEREAS, (the portion of Auditor Report No. 06-04, 42 "Financial Audit of the Department of Land and Natural 43 Resources", relating to the operation and management of the 44 Division of Boating and Ocean Recreation, found that although SCR77 SD1 LRB 10-2448.doc

some of the prior recommendations had been implemented, the
 absence of effective management oversight continues to plague
 the Boating Division; and

5 WHEREAS, in spite of the Legislature's continued efforts to 6 rectify the problem of repair, maintenance, and management of 7 the boat harbors, problems continue to persist; now, therefore, 8

BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-fifth 9 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2010, the 10 House of Representatives concurring, that the Auditor is 11 requested to conduct a follow-up audit to the 2001 Audit of the 12 Management of State Boating Facilities by the Department of Land 13 and Natural Resources (Report No. 01-09) and the portion of the 14 2006 Financial Audit of the Department of Land and Natural 15 Resources (Report No. 06-04) relating to the Division of Boating 16 and Ocean Recreation, particularly as it applies to the Ala Wai 17 Harbor; and 18

20 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Auditor is requested to 21 report findings and recommendations to the Legislature not later 22 than twenty days prior to the convening of the Regular Session 23 of 2011; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this
Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Chairperson of the
Board of Land and Natural Resources and the Auditor.

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
