## SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

## REQUESTING A MANAGEMENT AND FINANCIAL AUDIT OF DEPARTMENT OF TAXATION CONTRACTS.

WHEREAS, in 1999, the Department of Taxation (Department)
entered into a benefits funded contract with American Management
Systems, Inc., which later became CGI Technologies and
Solutions, Inc. (CGI), to create the Integrated Tax Information
Management System (ITIMS) project; and

7 WHEREAS, ITIMS helped modernize an aging technical
8 infrastructure, created new business processes, and allowed
9 reallocation of department staff to better serve the citizens
10 and taxpayers; and

12 WHEREAS, at the end of this five-year project, the 13 Department had integrated collections, net income, and business 14 taxes collectively into one application, which allowed the 15 majority of the tax clearance functions to be automated and the 16 Department's customer service representatives to provide a 17 one-stop service to taxpayer inquiries; and

WHEREAS, ITIMS was further enhanced by integrating a legacy
cashiering system and a data capture and imaging system known as
ITIMS Imaging System; and

WHEREAS, ITIMS was instrumental in implementing the county
surcharge on state taxes established by Act 247, Session Laws of
Hawaii 2005; and

WHEREAS, in January 2008, the Department entered into another contract with CGI to collect new delinquent taxes, with the new contract paid on a contingent fee basis, whereby CGI receives one third of all new delinquent taxes collected, up to a cap of \$25,000,000, subject to the State's realization of \$75,000,000 in total additional tax collections; and



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WHEREAS, in testimony before the Senate Committee on Ways 1 2 and Means on January 21, 2010, the Department stated that in the first eighteen months of the contract with CGI, new delinquent 3 4 tax collections have reached \$66,000,000, with \$22,000,000 paid 5 to CGI; and 6 7 WHEREAS, the Department also stated that the total amount of delinquent taxes to be collected by the end of the contract 8 9 on June 30, 2011, is estimated to be \$110,000,000, with a 10 maximum of \$25,000,000 to be paid to CGI; and 11 12 WHEREAS, in addition, the Department stated that prior to 13 the current \$25,000,000 delinguent tax collection contract 14 between the Department and CGI, CGI had contracted with the 15 Department - through sole source or procurement exemptions - for over \$60,000,000 related to ITIMS and its enhancements and 16 17 improvements, as follows: 18 19 (1)1999-2004 - Initial contract to build ITIMS cost 20 \$53,000,000; 21 (2) 22 2005-2006 - Enhancements to the system such as imaging, cashiering, and electronic filing cost 23 \$3,500,000; 24 25 26 (3) 2006-2009 - Production improvements cost \$3,000,000; 27 (4) 2006-2008 - County surcharge on general excise tax 28 cost \$3,000,000; and 29 30 31 (5) 2008-2011 - Current project to collect delinquent taxes, integrate all taxes into one system, and train 32 33 staff will cost up to \$25,000,000 (current cost is 34 \$22,000,000); and 35 36 WHEREAS, these payment amounts are substantial, particularly in light of the Department's current annual budget 37 of approximately \$20,000,000, and the State should be assured 38 39 that it is receiving full return on these expenditures and that the contract continues to be in the State's best public 40 41 interest; and 42 43 WHEREAS, the Legislature finds that an audit of the current 44 and past contracts should be conducted; now, therefore, SCR78 SD1 LRB 10-2446-1.doc



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BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-fifth 2 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2010, the 3 House of Representatives concurring, that the Auditor is 4 5 requested to conduct a management and financial audit of all contracts between the Department of Taxation, CGI Technologies 6 7 and Solutions, Inc., and its predecessor American Management 8 Systems, Inc.; and 9 10 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that, in the investigation of all contracts between the Department of Taxation and CGI 11

12 Technologies and Solutions, Inc., the Auditor is urged to use 13 all powers granted to the Auditor by the Hawaii Constitution and 14 the Hawaii Revised Statutes, including the power to issue 15 subpoenas to compel the appearance of witnesses and the 16 production of documents, to the fullest extent necessary to 17 fulfill the purposes of the management and financial audit; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Director of Taxation and
CGI Technologies and Solutions, Inc., are requested to cooperate
with the Auditor to the fullest extent possible during the
conduct of the management and financial audit; and

24 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED the Auditor is requested to submit 25 findings and recommendations of the audit to the Legislature no 26 later than twenty days prior the convening of the Regular 27 Session of 2011; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Taxation is requested to establish and implement a transition plan wherein department personnel shall assume all functions performed by employees of CGI Technologies and Solutions, Inc., under the current delinquent tax collection contract; and

35 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Taxation is 36 requested to report to the Legislature on the development and 37 implementation of the transition plan as soon as possible, but 38 not later than August 31, 2010; and

40 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 41 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Auditor and the 42 Director of Taxation, who, in turn, is requested to transmit a 43 copy to CGI Technologies and Solutions, Inc.

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
