SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING A REPORT ON TO THE ESTIMATED COST, COST SAVINGS, AND IMPACT OF PROVIDING AND EXPANDING ONLINE INSTRUCTION THROUGH THE HAWAII VIRTUAL LEARNING NETWORK'S PROGRAMS AND COURSES.

WHEREAS, the mission of the Hawaii Board of Education is to 1 promote excellence and equity in Hawaii's public schools and 2 enable all students to meet their own unique and varied 3 potentials; and 4 5 WHEREAS, the Legislature finds that traditional classroom 6 7 instruction offered by the Department of Education does not meet the needs of every student; and 8 9 WHEREAS, some students learn at a faster rate than their 10 11 peers, which causes those students to become bored at school; and 12 13 WHEREAS, the Department of Education is in the midst of an 14 15 unprecedented fiscal crisis; and 16 WHEREAS, instructional programs that require students to 17 conduct most of their studies online could lower the cost of 18 public education by reducing the number of teachers needed and 19 20 cutting the cost of operating school facilities; and 21 22 WHEREAS, Act 275, Session Laws of Hawaii 2007, established the Hawaii Online Task Force to develop a systematic plan to 23 expand opportunities for online learning to enhance the learning 24 experiences of students across the State; and 25 26 WHEREAS, the Hawaii Virtual Learning Network, a product of 27 the Hawaii Online Task Force, is a collaborative partnership of 28 29 the Department of Education's E-School, Myron B. Thompson Academy, and the University of Hawaii Online Learning Academy 30

1 that establishes criteria for, evaluates, and approves online courses to be offered in Hawaii's schools; offers training for 2 Hawaii teachers to serve as online instructors; provides 3 centralized support services to online students; and establishes 4 partnerships with institutes of higher education, private 5 schools, charter schools, state virtual schools, and commercial 6 7 vendors; and 8 9 WHEREAS, the Department of Education already offers online courses to high school and middle school students through 10 various initiatives such as the Hawaii Virtual Learning Network; 11 12 and 13 WHEREAS, the Legislature finds that that the Hawaii Virtual 14 15 Learning Network has made laudable efforts to increase on-time graduation rates, increase student achievement and interest, 16 prepare students for the workforce, and lower the cost of public 17 education; now, therefore, 18 19 20 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-fifth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2010, the 21 House of Representatives concurring, that the Department of 22 23 Education is requested to report to the Legislature: 24 The cost of providing online instruction through the 25 (1)Hawaii Virtual Learning Network, in total and per 26 student, and estimated cost savings of providing 27 28 online versus classroom instruction; 29 30 (2) The cost of expanding the Network's programs or courses, including costs for technology and 31 32 infrastructure, technical support, additional teaching materials, and occasional face-to-face meetings 33 34 between teachers and students; 35 36 (3) The impact of the courses or programs provided through the Network on students and teachers who participate 37 in the Network's programs or courses; and 38 39 The academic achievement, including measures of 40 (4) improved learning if any, of student participants in 41 the Network's programs or courses; and 42 43
