SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

URGING THE COUNTY OF KAUA'I TO RESTORE PRINCE KUHIO PARK TO ITS FORMER CONFIGURATION.

WHEREAS, Prince Jonah Kuhio Kalaniana'ole of Hawai'i was a 1 prince of the Kalakaua line and an heir of Kaumauali'i, the 2 ruling chief of Kaua'i before the overthrow of the Kingdom of 3 4 Hawai'i; and 5 WHEREAS, Prince Jonah Kuhio Kalaniana'ole later served as a 6 7 delegate to the United States Congress from 1903 until his death in 1922; and 8 9 WHEREAS, Prince Jonah Kuhio Kalaniana'ole tirelessly worked 10 for native Hawaiian rights, most notably by his direct 11 12 involvement in the creation of the Hawaiian Homes Commission Act, 1920, which allowed native Hawaiians to homestead on public 13 land; and 14 15 WHEREAS, Prince Kuhio Park in Koloa on the island of Kaua'i 16 is an historical and cultural treasure, preserving the .17 foundation of Prince Kuhio's royal home and fishpond, as well as 18 the Ho'ai Heiau; and 19 20 WHEREAS, the County of Kaua'i constructed Lawa'i Beach Road 21 through the park after Hurricane Iwa; and 22 23 WHEREAS, the current path of Lawa'i Beach Road essentially 24 restricts water flow from the historic fishpond to the ocean, 25 resulting in compromised water quality; and 26 27 WHEREAS, it is imperative to the integrity of this historic 28 place that the natural flow of water be restored and preserved; 29 now, therefore, 30
