SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH TO STUDY THE FEASIBILITY OF IMPROVING EMERGENCY MEDICAL TRANSPORTATION ON THE ISLAND OF KAUAI.

1	WHEREAS, the protection and preservation of the health of	
2	Hawaii's people is a matter of compelling state interest; and

4	WHEREAS, emergency ambulance services, available twenty-	
5	four hours a day, can help reduce medical emergency deaths,	
6	injuries, and permanent long-term disability, and are a key	
7	component of the State's comprehensive emergency medical	
8	services	system; and

10	WHEREAS, a timely response and immediate transport to an	
11	acute care treatment facility are keys to preventing	
12	irreversi	ble damage or death; and

14	WHEREAS, the island of Kauai has five ambulance units that are located in:	
15	are locat	ed in:

31	WHEREAS, while the five units have worked out a "back-up"	
32	coverage	plan that has adequately served the island, it has

1 created hardships for emergency medical services personnel and the public; and 2 3 4 WHEREAS, more needs to be done in the face of Kauai's 5 population growth, such as: 6 7 Ensuring coverage for areas such as Kalaheo, when (1)8 Waimea or Poipu ambulance units are unavailable; and 9 10 (2) Supporting medical infrastructure and emergency resources available at Kauai Veterans Memorial 11 12 Hospital; and 13 WHEREAS, although the recent recession has slowed the 14 15 future planned development for Kauai, the population on the west side of Kauai is projected to increase dramatically; and a large 16 number of residents are elderly persons, which increases the 17 need for immediate emergency care; now, therefore, 18 19 20 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-fifth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2010, the 21 House of Representatives concurring, that the Department of 22 Health is requested to study the feasibility of improving 23 emergency medical transportation services on Kauai by developing 24 a more comprehensive coordination plan between ambulance units, 25 hiring more staff, making better use of volunteers, and 26 establishing an ambulance unit on the west side of Kauai, based 27 28 in Kalaheo, and in any other viable manner as determined by the 29 Department; and 30 31 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Health is 32 requested to report its findings and recommendations to the Legislature no later than twenty days before the convening of 33 34 the Regular Session of 2011; and 35 36 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Governor, Director 37 of Health, and Mayor of Kauai. 38
