SENATE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE ESTABLISHMENT OF A TASK FORCE TO EXAMINE THE FEASIBILITY OF LOWERING THE AGE OF PHARMACY-ADMINISTERED VACCINATION RECIPIENTS TO NINE YEARS OLD.

WHEREAS, many children in our communities do not have ready access to vaccinations, thereby making them more susceptible to disease; and

WHEREAS, the present economic recession makes gaining access to vaccinations even more difficult for struggling families; and

WHEREAS, pharmacies are located throughout our communities and often have more extensive hours of operation than physicians' offices so that our residents can easily gain access to them; and

WHEREAS, pharmacists who administer vaccinations must go through special training related to immunizations; and

WHEREAS, pharmacists who administer vaccines have adult and child cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) training available;

WHEREAS, eighteen states have enacted legislation that allows pharmacists to immunize patients as young as nine years of age, thereby providing families with young children more access to the benefits of immunization; and

WHEREAS, lowering the age restrictions for pharmacistadministered vaccinations will improve community access to potentially life-saving vaccines and will serve as a valuable preventative tool by allowing for quick and effective vaccination of a large number of people in the event of a public health emergency in Hawaii, such as the H1N1 flu outbreak; now, therefore,
