SENATE RESOLUTION

EXPRESSING SUPPORT FOR THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII AT HILO COLLEGE OF PHARMACY'S EFFORTS TO OBTAIN FEDERAL FUNDING TO ESTABLISH THE BIG ISLAND OF HAWAII AS A BEACON COMMUNITY.

1 WHEREAS, federal funding opportunities for the increased use of technology in the provision of health care have never 2 been greater and Hawaii's unique cultural and geographical 3 position makes it an optimal place to initiate health 4 5 information technology projects; and 6 7 WHEREAS, the State Legislature has been on the cutting edge of bold initiatives to increase access to medical care 8 9 throughout the State by supporting the use of telehealth services and expanding the role of medical providers to practice 10 at the full extent of their capabilities; and 11 12 WHEREAS, the Big Island of Hawaii has some of the most 13 14 rural areas in the entire state and is an ideal community to develop a sustainable model of health information sharing to 15 help reduce health care costs, increase quality, and expand 16 17 access to care; and 18 WHEREAS, the Big Island as a community, led by the 19 University of Hawaii at Hilo College of Pharmacy in partnership 20 with locally-based hospital systems, professional organizations, 21 22 health plans, health centers, academic institutions, quality improvement organizations, and many others, will be pursuing 23 24 federal grant moneys to participate in the Beacon Community 25 Program; and 26 WHEREAS, the Beacon Community Program, federally-funded 27 28 through the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act, will include \$220,000,000 in grants to build and strengthen health 29 30 information technology infrastructure and health information exchange capabilities, including stronger privacy and security 31 measures for data exchange; and 32 33



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1 WHEREAS, the Beacon Community Program's goal is to 2 establish cooperative agreements with communities to build and 3 strengthen the communities' health information technology 4 infrastructure and health information exchange capabilities to 5 achieve measurable improvements in health care quality, safety, 6 efficiency, and population health; and 7

8 WHEREAS, the Big Island's participation in the Beacon 9 Community Program will inform efforts throughout the United 10 States to support the meaningful use of electronic health 11 records, the primary goal of the federal government's new health 12 information technology initiative; and 13

14 WHEREAS, the Big Island's participation in the Beacon 15 Community Program can be seen as a first step in the development 16 of a statewide health information exchange and can serve as a 17 learning environment to gain a better understanding of the 18 issues that will be faced when the State is ready to promote 19 health information technology on a larger scale; and 20

21 WHEREAS, the Legislature supports locally-based efforts and 22 collaboration to secure federal funding that will assist in 23 making Hawaii a model for implementation of health information 24 technology; now, therefore,

25 26 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-fifth 27 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2010, 28 that the Legislature express support for the University of 29 Hawaii at Hilo College of Pharmacy's application to receive a 30 federally-funded Beacon Community Program grant; and 31

32 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 33 Resolution be transmitted to the Dean of the University of 34 Hawaii at Hilo College of Pharmacy, the Director of Human 35 Services, the Director of Health, and the members of Hawaii's 36 congressional delegation.
