SENATE RESOLUTION

URGING THE PROVISION OF ORIENTATION AND ADDITIONAL TRAINING TO INCREASE THE ABILITY OF STATE AGENCY CASE WORKERS TO ADDRESS THE ISSUES FACED BY GRANDPARENTS RAISING GRANDCHILDREN.

WHEREAS, as a result of the work of the Joint Legislative 1 Committee on Family Caregiving, Act 11, Special Session Laws of 2 Hawaii 2008, established a Grandparents Raising Grandchildren 3 Task Force to assess and report on the needs and issues of 4 5 grandparents raising grandchildren; and 6 7 WHEREAS, the final report generated by the Grandparents Raising Grandchildren Task Force found as a result of a March 8 2009 Grandparents Raising Grandchildren (GRG) Focus Group that 9 participants with grandchildren in the custody of Child 10 Protective Services (CPS) or the Department of Human Services 11 (DHS) expressed common frustration with DHS case workers because 12 13 grandparents did not receive enough information from DHS workers; and 14 15 16 WHEREAS, observations in the March 2009 GRG Focus Group 17 show that: 18 19 Grandparents have little or no understanding of laws (1) that drive a CPS case and may misunderstand the role 20 21 of a DHS case worker; 22 23 (2) Grandparents raising grandchildren often feel afraid, intimidated, helpless, and angry; 24 25 Many grandparents raising grandchildren do not seek 26 (3) help from DHS because they are afraid that "the 27 system" will remove their grandchildren from their 28 29 care; 30 (4) Some DHS case workers: 31 32



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- Do not respect cultural values related to the 1 (A) sacredness of the grandparent/grandchild 2 relationship; 3 4 5 Do not respect the senior as the grandparent with (B) knowledge about the history of the child's 6 7 family; 8 9 (C) Do not acknowledge a grandparent's right to have a view of the best interest of the grandchildren; 10 and 11 12 Do not provide the grandparent with emotional 13 (D) support; rather the grandparents reported 14 15 experiencing distress in relations with some workers; and 16 17 Many grandparents do not know about current laws and 18 (5) 19 subsidies that are designed to help and protect them; 20 now, therefore, 21 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-fifth 22 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2010, 23 that the Department of Human Services is urged to provide 24 orientation and additional training to increase the ability of 25 DHS case workers to address the issues faced by grandparents who 26 raise grandchildren, including increasing case workers' 27 28 awareness about: 29 Local cultural beliefs regarding the important roles 30 (1) 31 of grandparents within the family structure, 32 especially when grandchildren need care; 33 34 (2) What grandparents experience (fear, helplessness, and anger) when their grandchildren are taken into custody 35 36 by Child Protective Services or placed in foster care, and there are rules for having contacts with their 37 grandchildren; and 38 39 Grandparents' need for clear explanations to 40 (3) understand guidelines for managing cases involving 41 children in state custody who need foster care and a 42 safe permanent home; and 43 44



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1 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Human 2 Services is requested to submit a report to the Legislature no 3 later than twenty days prior to the convening of the 2011 4 Regular Session on the initiatives the Department has 5 implemented to increase the ability of DHS case workers to 6 understand and address the issues faced by grandparents who 7 raise grandchildren; and

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9 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 10 Resolution be transmitted to the Director of Human Services, the 11 Director of the Executive Office on Aging, the County Executive 12 of the City and County of Honolulu Elderly Affairs Division, the 13 Coordinator for the Department of Health Foster Care Licensing 14 Unit, and the Administrator of the Social Services Division of 15 the Department of Human Services.
