## SENATE RESOLUTION

EXPRESSING SUPPORT FOR REPEAL OF THE DON'T ASK DON'T TELL POLICY OF THE UNITED STATES ARMED SERVICES.

WHEREAS, Title 10, United States Code, Section 654 sets out 1 the policy concerning homosexuality in the armed services, which 2 provides in pertinent part that "A member of the armed services 3 shall be separated from the armed services under regulations 4 prescribed by the Secretary of Defense . . . "; and 5 6 7 WHEREAS, "Don't ask, don't tell" is the denomination of the 8 policy of the United States Armed Services to stop gay, lesbian, 9 and bisexual individuals from serving in the military; and 10 WHEREAS, President Barack Obama, United States Secretary of 11 Defense Robert Gates, and Chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff 12 Admiral Mike Mullen have expressed their preference for ending 13 the ban on homosexual individuals serving in the United States 14 15 Armed Services; and 16 WHEREAS, in his State of the Union address, President Obama 17 said he would work with Congress and the military to repeal the 18 1993 law that bars openly gay and lesbian people from serving in 19 20 the military; and 21 22 WHEREAS, Admiral Mullen testified before the United States 23 Congress on February 2, 2010, that letting gays serve openly in the military is "the right thing to do . . . I cannot escape 24 being troubled by the fact that we have in place a policy which 25 forces young men and women to lie about who they are in order to 26 defend their fellow citizens"; and 27 28 29 WHEREAS, it has been reported that since going into effect in 1993, "Don't ask, don't tell" has resulted in the discharge 30 of more than 13,500 service members for being gay, and at the 31 present time when the military is desperately short of foreign-32 language expertise, it has fired over sixty-five gay Arabic and 33 Farsi linguists; and 34 35

1 WHEREAS, anytime there is a restriction on the pool of candidates from which one is recruiting which is unrelated to 2 the task at hand, one ends up excluding outstanding people whose 3 presence would improve the organization's performance; and 4 5 WHEREAS, allowing homosexuals to serve in the military 6 7 would significantly augment the nation's military capabilities; 8 and 9 10 WHEREAS, homophobia has no place in a modern, enlightened society, and the military is no exception; now, therefore, 11 12 13 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-fifth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2010, 14 15 that the Legislature expresses support for repeal of the "don't ask, don't tell" policy of the United States Armed Services, and 16 of the federal law upon which it is based; and 17 18 19 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 20 Resolution be transmitted to the President of the United States; Secretary of Defense Robert Gates; Chairman of the Joint Chiefs 21 of Staff Admiral Mike Mullen; the Majority Leader of the United 22 States Senate, the Speaker of the United States House of 23

24 Representatives, and Hawaii's congressional delegation.
