## SENATE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE ESTABLISHMENT OF A COMMITTEE TO DEVELOP A PLAN TO STUDY AND IMPLEMENT STRUCTURAL AND OPERATIONAL IMPROVEMENTS TO INCREASE THE EFFECTIVENESS OF THE HAWAII HEALTH SYSTEMS CORPORATION AND ITS REGIONS.

1 WHEREAS, the Hawaii Health Systems Corporation, a network 2 of five regions and thirteen facilities spanning five islands 3 across the State, is one of the largest public hospital systems 4 in the nation and is an important safety valve during this 5 economic downturn; and

7 WHEREAS, the Hawaii Health Systems Corporation has 8 experienced unprecedented fiscal challenges that have led to an 9 unsustainable reliance on government subsidies, totaling 10 \$649,200,000 since it was established fourteen years ago; and 11

12 WHEREAS, the State does not have the fiscal capacity to 13 continue funding the Hawaii Health Systems Corporation at its 14 current level; and

16 WHEREAS, section 31 of the General Appropriations Act of 17 2009 mandated an eight-prong comprehensive, independent review 18 and evaluation of the management and operations of the Hawaii 19 Health Systems Corporation, its regional systems boards, and its 20 facilities, including the effectiveness of its current 21 organizational structure; and

23 WHEREAS, Stroudwater Associates was retained to conduct the 24 study, which was released December 28, 2009. The study concludes that the Hawaii Health Systems Corporation is in a 25 financially perilous condition and that the age and condition of 26 its facilities and other physical assets are well beyond 27 national averages, prompting serious concerns as to the levels 28 of quality of care and safety available at Hawaii's public 29 hospital network; and 30

32 WHEREAS, the Stroudwater Associates' Study (Study) found 33 that a new sustainability plan for restructuring is needed to 34 diminish the burden of general fund subsidies for the vital

health care services provided by Hawaii Health Systems 1 2 Corporation; and 3 4 WHEREAS, the Study specifically concludes that the 5 conversion of the Hawaii Health Systems Corporation from a public benefit corporation to a private nonprofit corporation is 6 essential, that the Hawaii Health Systems Corporation requires 7 8 recapitalization, and that increased applications of efficiencies of scale and expertise inherent in the system model 9 of governance are needed to increase effectiveness; and 10 11 12 WHEREAS, given that the Hawaii Health Systems Corporation's 13 ability to implement a successful transition to a private nonprofit entity is dependent on further extensive analysis, 14 planning, funding, and collaboration, the drafting of 15 16 legislation based on the Study's recommendations for the 2010 Regular Session is premature; and 17 18 19 WHEREAS, given the on-going and grave economic challenges that both the State and the market are facing, the current 20 21 fiscal situation presents the Hawaii Health Systems Corporation 22 with an opportunity to reevaluate and restructure operationally and organizationally; and 23 24 25 WHEREAS, the Hawaii Health Systems Corporation can take advantage of this opportunity to increase its efficiency not 26 only for the short-term, but also to increase its resiliency and 27 prepare for future economic challenges; and 28 29 WHEREAS, the Hawaii Health Systems Corporation must also 30 aggressively pursue cost-reduction initiatives, including but 31 not limited to those outlined in the Study, while further 32 improving its marketability and public-private partnership 33 potential; now, therefore, 34 35 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-fifth 36 37 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2010, that the Senate President and Speaker of the House of 38 Representatives establish a committee to study and plan the 39 transformation of the Hawaii Health Systems Corporation to an 40 organizational structure that responds more effectively to the 41 42 health care needs of the island communities it serves; and 43

1 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the committee shall be named 2 the Committee on Transitioning the Hawaii Health Systems Corporation (Committee); and 3 4 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the planning include, as 5 6 appropriate, collaboration among the various stakeholders and potential partners, examination of potential sources of funding 7 of the capitalization and transition costs, examination of the 8 9 Hawaii Health Systems Corporation's marketability and potential partnerships, and review of the implementation of operational 10 and organizational efficiencies including but not limited to 11 those identified in the Study as currently available to Hawaii 12 13 Health Systems Corporation; and 14 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Committee shall consist of 15 16 the following members: 17 18 (1) One member from each Regional System Board of 19 Directors and the Hawaii Health Systems Corporation Board of Directors; 20 21 22 (2) The Regional Chief Executive Officers and the President or Chief Executive Officer of the Hawaii 23 24 Health Systems Corporation; 25 (3) An appointee of the President of the Senate from the 26 27 Senate and an appointee of the Speaker of the House from the House of Representatives; 28 29 30 (4)A representative of the State Administration appointed 31 by the Governor; 32 33 (5) The President and Chief Executive Officer of the 34 Healthcare Association of Hawaii; 35 (6) 36 One representative each from the Hawaii Government Employees Association and United Public Workers; 37 38 Two community members; and 39 (7) 40 One representative of the Hawaii Health Systems 41 (8) 42 Corporation employees; and 43

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the members of the Committee 1 shall select a chairperson from among themselves, and the 2 chairperson is requested to convene meetings; and 3 4 -5 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Committee advertise and hold public meetings for the purpose of gathering input from the 6 7 served regions; and 8 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Hawaii Health Systems 9 10 Corporation administration shall staff the Committee for administrative purposes, and the Committee shall begin its work 11 12 no later than thirty days after the adoption of this measure; and 13 14 15 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Committee is requested to 16 submit a report of its recommendations, including any proposed legislation, to the Legislature no later than twenty days prior 17 18 to the convening of the Regular Session of 2011; and 19 20 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Legislative Reference Bureau is requested to assist the Committee in drafting its 21 22 recommendations and proposed legislation; and 23 24 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 25 Resolution be transmitted to the Governor, Director of Health, President and Chief Executive Officer of the Hawaii Health 26 Systems Corporation, Chairperson of the Hawaii Health Systems 27 Corporation Board of Directors, the Chairperson of each Regional 28 System Board of Directors, the President of the Healthcare 29 Association of Hawaii, the Director of the Legislative Reference 30 31 Bureau, the Hawaii Government Employees Association, and the 32 United Public Workers.
