## SENATE RESOLUTION

URGING THE DEVELOPMENT OF CRITERIA AND RECOMMENDATIONS FOR THE IMPLEMENTATION OF AN ENVIRONMENTALLY PREFERRED PURCHASING POLICY FOR THE STATE.

WHEREAS, the Hawaii Clean Energy Initiative is charting a 1 2 new path toward an energy-independent future for Hawaii, by reducing Hawaii's energy use through increased efficiency and 3 developing local renewable energy sources; and 4 5 WHEREAS, Hawaii is committed to the stewardship of the 6 7 environment and developing a sustainable way of life; and 8 9 WHEREAS, the state government is one of the largest 10 employers in the State, and has great purchasing power; and 11 WHEREAS, by reducing the adverse environmental impact of 12 13 the State's purchasing decisions by buying goods and services from manufacturers and vendors who share this commitment to the 14 environment, the state government can minimize negative 15 environmental and social effects through the use of 16 environmentally friendly products; and 17 18 19 WHEREAS, environmentally preferred purchasing, green procurement, affirmative procurement, eco-procurement, and 20 environmentally responsible purchasing all refer to the method 21 whereby environmental and social considerations are given equal 22 weight with the price, availability, and performance criteria 23 24 that institutions use to make purchasing decisions; and 25 26 WHEREAS, similar procurement policies have been implemented by the federal government, in several cities including Santa 27 Monica and Berkeley, California, and major institutions 28 29 including Arizona State University; and 30 WHEREAS, the Department of Accounting and General Services 31 has been certified as a Hawaii Green Government Agency, and has 32 made significant improvements to state buildings to reduce 33 energy and water usage; and 34 35



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WHEREAS, institutional green purchasing, combined with 1 2 facility improvements, will have a significant impact on reducing Hawaii's energy consumption and promote similar 3 4 practices throughout the State; and 5 6 WHEREAS, ENERGY STAR fluorescent light bulbs use seventyfive per cent less energy and last ten times longer than 7 incandescent bulbs; and 8 9 10 WHEREAS, purchasing recyclable and biodegradable products, such as paper towels, hand soaps, and other disposable products 11 can help promote the businesses that supply these products and 12 reduce pollution to our ocean and the water supply; and 13 14 WHEREAS, purchasing only vehicles with high efficiency 15 ratings will save money, reduce greenhouse gas emissions, and 16 demonstrate a strong commitment to Hawaii's clean energy future; 17 18 now, therefore, 19 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-fifth 20 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2010, 21 22 that the Procurement Policy Board is urged to develop criteria 23 and recommendations for the implementation of an environmentally preferred purchasing policy for the State; and 24 25 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Procurement Policy Board 26 shall submit a report to the Legislature no later than twenty 27 days prior to the convening of the 2011 Regular Session on its 28 findings and recommendations, including any proposed 29 30 legislation; and 31 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 32 Resolution be transmitted to the Governor and the Chairperson of 33 the Procurement Policy Board. 34 35 36
