SENATE RESOLUTION

CONVENING A LEGISLATIVE NOISE POLLUTION TASK FORCE TO REVIEW BEST PRACTICES FROM OTHER STATES IN REDUCING URBAN NOISE POLLUTION.

WHEREAS, the traditional definition of noise is "unwanted 1 or disturbing sound", which becomes unwanted when it either 2 interferes with normal activities such as sleeping, 3 conversation, or disrupts or diminishes one's quality of life; 4 and 5 6 WHEREAS, the fact that you cannot see, taste, or smell 7 noise may help explain why it has not received as much attention 8 9 as other types of pollution, such as air pollution, or water 10 pollution; and 11 12 WHEREAS, noise pollution can have major consequences, primarily to a person's overall health; and 13 14 WHEREAS, studies have shown that there are direct links 15 between noise and health and problems related to noise including 16 stress related illnesses, high blood pressure, speech 17 interference, hearing loss, sleep disruption, and lost 18 productivity; and 19 20 WHEREAS, noise induced hearing loss is the most common and 21 often discussed health effect, but research has shown that 22 exposure to constant or high levels of noise can cause countless 23 adverse health effects; now, therefore, 24 25 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-fifth 26 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2010, 27 that there is convened a Legislative Noise Pollution Task Force 28 29 to review best practices from other states in reducing noise 30 pollution; and 31 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Task Force is requested to 32 33 consist of: 34
