SENATE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE CORRECTIONS POPULATION MANAGEMENT COMMISSION TO RESUME ITS MEETINGS AND TO MEET AT LEAST QUARTERLY.

WHEREAS, the Corrections Population Management Commission 1 2 was established by Act 343, Session Laws of Hawaii 1993; and 3 WHEREAS, the Commission was expanded from eight to eleven 4 members, to represent all three branches of state government, 5 the county departments of the prosecuting attorney, and two 6 community representatives; and 7 8 WHEREAS, the objective of the Commission is "to establish 9 maximum inmate population limits for each correctional facility 10 and to formulate policies and procedures to prevent the inmate 11 population from exceeding the capacity of each correctional 12 13 facility"; and 14 WHEREAS, the Commission is administratively attached to the 15 Department of Public Safety; and 16 17 WHEREAS, the closure of Kulani Correctional Facility should 18 have been brought before and discussed by the Commission; and 19 20 21 WHEREAS, the Commission failed to hold meetings from 2003 to 2008, as required by law; and 22 23 24 WHEREAS, when the Commission began meeting again in 2008, the Department of Public Safety failed to distribute population 25 reports to the Commission; and 26 27 WHEREAS, the Commission has been denied input on important 28 decisions relating to the corrections population in facilities 29 located in Hawaii and out-of-state; and 30 31 WHEREAS, the Commission was excluded from the discussion 32 and decision to close Kulani Correctional Facility; and 33 34

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1 WHEREAS, the Commission was established by law to assist the State in satisfying the requirements of a consent decree, 2 which was the result of the 1985 lawsuit regarding overcrowding 3 in correctional facilities; and 4 5 WHEREAS, the placement of fifty-four per cent of Hawaii's 6 corrections population in private prisons on the continental 7 United States should be a matter of discussion and debate for 8 the Commission: now, therefore, 9 10 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-fifth 11 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2010, 12 that the Corrections Population Management Commission is 13 requested to resume its meetings and to meet at least quarterly 14 to carry out its objectives; and 15 16 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Public Safety 17 is requested to distribute population reports and other relevant 18 population information at Commission meetings; and 19 20 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that in the interest of full public 21 disclosure, the Department of Public Safety is requested to make 22 all handouts, population reports, and related information 23 available on its website; and 24 25 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 26 Resolution be transmitted to the Governor, the Director of 27 Public Safety, the Executive Secretary of the Corrections 28 Population Management Commission, and the Attorney General. 29

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
